Veterans are at risk for suicide for all the reasons a non-veteran might be, such as coping with the effects of aging, legal problems, exposure to bullying behavior, relationship problems or financial stress.

Additionally, veterans may be dealing with lingering effects from their military service, difficulties with readjusting to family roles and civilian life after discharge, and underlying mental health and/or substance abuse issues aggravated by their military service.
