LAND USE HEARING

THE MORROW COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION will hold the following hearings of public interest on Tuesday, September 25, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. at the Port of Morrow Riverfront Center, Boardman, Oregon.

Conditional Use Permit CUP-N-332: Solar Star Oregon I, LLC, applicant, and Lawrence and Corrine Lindsay, owner. The property is described as tax lots 2803 and 2805 of Assessor's Map 1N 25E. The property is zoned EFU and located north of Lexington on Juniper Canyon Road between Baseline Lane and Strawberry Lane. Request is to allow by conditional use the construction and operation of a 10 megawatt Photovoltaic Solar Array. Criteria for approval includes the Morrow County Zoning Ordinance (MCZO) Article 3 Section 3.010 EFU and Article 6 Conditional Uses.

Comprehensive Plan Amendment AC-122-18: Solar Star Oregon I, LLC, applicant, and Lawrence and Corrine Lindsay, owner. The property is described as tax lots 2803 and 2805 of Assessor's Map 1N 25E. The property is zoned EFU and located north of Lexington on Juniper Canyon Road between Baseline Lane and Strawberry Lane. Request is to amend the Morrow County Comprehensive Plan (MCCP) taking an exception to Goal 3 Agricultural Lands to allow for solar development on up to 80 acres in the EFU zone. Criteria for approval includes MCZO Article 8 Amendments and the MCCP Review and Revision Process. This is the first of at least two public hearings with the final hearing before the Board of Commissioners.

Transportation System Plan Amendment ATSP-123-18: Morrow County Public Works, applicant and owner. The property is described as tax lot 300 of Assessor's Map 1S 25, is the Lexington Airport, and is zoned EFU with the Air Industrial use zone applied as an overlay. It is located just north of the Town of Lexington and west of Highway 207. Request is to adopt the Airport Layout Plan as part of the Morrow County Transportation System Plan. Criteria for approval includes MCZO Article 8 Amendments and the MCCP Review and Revision Process. This is the first of at least two public hearings with the final hearing before the Board of Commissioners.

Opportunity to voice support or opposition to the above proposal or to ask questions will be provided.

Failure to raise an issue in person or by letter or failure to provide sufficient specificity to afford the decision maker an opportunity to respond to the issue precludes appeal to the Land Use Board of Appeals based on those issues.
