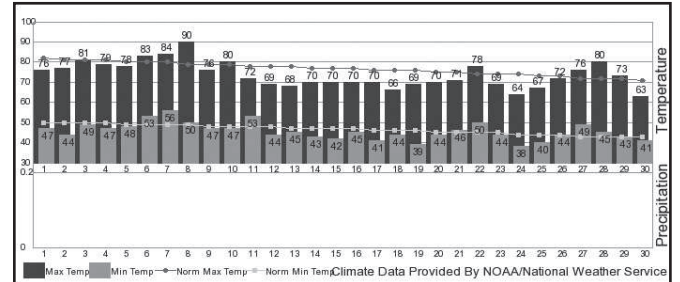

September colder than normal

According to preliminary data received by NOAA's National Weather Service in Pendleton, temperatures at Heppner averaged colder than normal during the month of September.

The average temperature was 59.7 degrees which was 1.9 degrees below normal. High Temperatures averaged 73.7 degrees, which was 2.9 degrees below normal. The highest was 90 degrees on the 8th. Low temperatures averaged 45.6 degrees, which was 1.0 degree below normal. The lowest was 38 degrees, on the 24th.

Precipitation totaled zero inches during September.



ber, which was 0.56 inches below normal.

Precipitation this year has reached 6.86 inches, which is 3.08 inches below normal. Since October, the water year precipitation at Heppner has been 10.62 inches, which is 3.38 inches below normal.

The highest wind gust was 33 mph which occurred on the 16th.

The outlook for October from NOAA's Climate Prediction Center calls for near normal temperatures and below normal precipitation. Normal highs for Heppner fall from 71 degrees at the start of October to 58 degrees at the end of October. Normal lows fall from 42 degrees to 35 degrees. The 30-year normal precipitation is 1.14 inches.
