

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office has released the following information:

August 4 (cont.): Morrow County Sheriff's Office received a report on Linden Way, Heppner that subject needs EMS. Transported.

Jackson Lehman was next with five and with four each were Wilson, Tyler Carter and Hayden Hyatt. With three tackles each were Derek Howard and Kevin Rea. ductions, \$158,129 in tax revenue and \$85,361 in other operating revenue for \$1,150,054 in total operating revenue; \$1,115,335 in total operating expenses, a non-operating gain of \$16,345 for a \$51,064 gain for the month, a \$48,519 year-to-date loss and a \$16,173 average monthly year to date loss.

The financials for August showed a net loss of \$115,910 for the month. Mahoney also reported that the audit report showed a positive gain for \$420,000 for the year ending June 30, 2018. She said it was a clean audit with no recommendations given.

The board received notice that Umatilla Electric turned down the district's request to lower or forgive the \$25,000 fee for bringing additional power to the Irrigon Medical Clinic for the MRI unit. Power was brought into the clinic the week of September 13. Installation of flooring and HVAC environmental controls began the week of September 17. The IMC parking lot was completed with a total price of \$84,974, below the bid price of \$88,162.
