

The Class 3-3Y rating is due to recent additions and upgrades to operating programs and apparatus. A federal grant assisting paid staff for seven days per week coverage is now established within the fire district budget. Installing a full-time training officer proved effective with

detailed planning and execution of training improvements. The purchase of a new ladder truck in 2015 was accomplished with award commitment from the Columbia River Enterprise Zone (CREZII).

Volunteer staff is a key component of this survey. Boardman Rural Fire District can always use more volunteers to assist. If you or anyone you know are interested, please contact me at the fire station. I would also like to thank local business, City of Boardman and the Port of Morrow.
