iCan Shine is a non-profit organization that collaborates with local organizations to host camps in their communities. This camp is hosted by the Hermiston School District and Hermiston Kiwanis.

The program uses adapted equipment, trained

professionals and volunteers. With 75 minutes of instruction over five days, over 80 percent of riders learn to ride a conventional bicycle independently by the end of camp.

Volunteers are also needed for the June camp in Hermiston. Volunteers must be 15 years old or older. For information on volunteering, visit the website above.

## Morrow SWCD to purge Myrtle spurge

The Morrow Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) was recently awarded grants from the Wildhorse Foundation and the Howard and Beth Bryant Foundation to locate and remove Myrtle spurge from the Heppner area.

A native of Europe and Asia, Myrtle spurge was mental plant for gardens. Its tolerance to drought, tightly clustered leaves and attractive blue-green color made it a favorite for landscaping. But this evergreen perennial is not as friendly as it appears.

Myrtle spurge contains a toxic, milky sap that can cause severe skin irritation and blistering. For some individuals, the sap can cause a severe allergic reaction, possibly leading to more serious symptoms. Now considered an invasive noxious weed by the Oregon State Weed Board, the spurge has escaped yards and gardens

> The Morrow Soil and Water Conservation District is acting to prevent the unwanted spread of this potential menace with help from the public. They are asking Heppner residents to report any known locations of this plant. The SWCD will map out the locations, remove the spurge with landowner permission and offer replacement plantings
