Will reach \$10 million by 2028

The Columbia River Enterprise Zone (CREZ) continues to be a success story in Morrow County and board members were told last week that achievement is going to continue into the future. A report on expected future revenue was presented by Manager Greg Sweek, and it showed income increasing from the current year \$3.5 million to a peak of over \$10 million in 2028.

The CREZ's money comes from businesses who have located or expanded into the zone, located mainly at the Port of Morrow payments made in lieu of property taxes.
