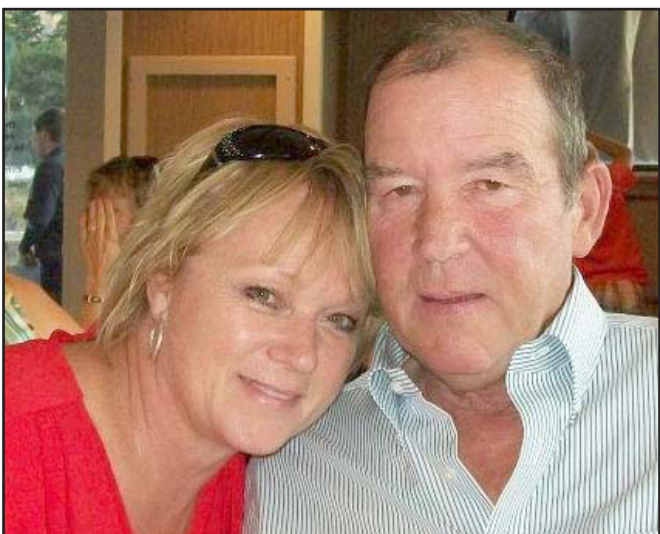


Greenup benefit this Saturday

ferent strains. Smith said there is good science that estimates which strain is likely to hit this winter and those are the shots they will give. She also pointed out that some people will say that they still got the flu even after receiving shots, but usually their bout will be less severe if they have been given the shots. She said the Health Department will be giving them soon.

Grants to cities

At an earlier August 7 meeting the commissioners discussed the current grants to cities programs the county does each bud-

get year. In the current year the county gives cities in the county a total of \$400,000. This year Boardman received \$123,118, Heppner \$75,661, Irrigon \$89,432, Ione \$56,539 and Lexington \$55,251. The distribution is based on each cities' population. The total amount given is the same as last year but double the amount from the 2017-18 fiscal year. The commissioners voted to use the same distribution formula for the money as in previous years.

Commissioner Doherty said the grants are an addi-

tional burden the county has taken on around the county but it helps out the cities. "There are not a lot of side boards, (guidelines on what cities can spend the money on)," he said, "but I think people need to know about the grants." Russell said he doesn't want to see the funds used for ongoing programs. "I would hate to see someone get hired for an on-going project and then not get funded again." Commissioner Melissa Lindsay wanted to see the money used for infrastructure projects that benefit the people of the cities.

Meeting to discuss Wheatridge project to be held

The Wheatridge Renewable Energy Facility project will be the first major renewable energy project in North America to co-locate wind, solar and battery storage and will be developed in Morrow County. Businesses and individuals are invited to attend a meeting Sept. 4 at 5:30 p.m. in the conference room at Heppner City Hall

to discuss services that can be provided for the project.

The wind portion of the project is scheduled to begin in December 2019 with approximately 100 contracted workers that will increase to 300 at the peak of the project. The project is scheduled to be completed by the end of 2020.

A list of possible needs for the project could include

housing, food/catering, laundry, RV parks, electrical/construction supplies, groceries, gas stations, vehicle repair/supplies, waste disposal and a local concrete plant/manufacturer.
