Vendor space is still available for \$10 per table by contacting Becky Rietmann at 541-720-2040.

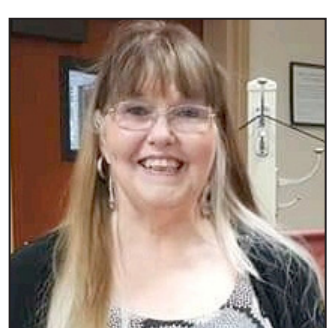
# Darlene Marquardt named Toastmaster of the Year

# Two arrested on home invasion in Irrigon

Abraham Barajas, 20 of Irrigon and Juan Rodriguez, 24 of Irrigon were both arrested and lodged in the Umatilla County Jail after the Morrow County Sheriff's Office received a call from an Irrigon resident that two individuals had entered his home uninvited and one pointed a firearm at him. During the call to the communications center at approximately 7 p.m. on Nov. 10, the caller said the two suspects had left the scene.

Shortly after the call, Patrol Sgt. Todd Siex and Deputy Tanner Cooney conducted a high-risk felony traffic stop on the suspect vehicle on Depot Lane in Irrigon. After investiga-

Abraham Barajas was charged with Burglary I, Criminal Trespass II, Carry Concealed Weapon-firearm, Unlawful Use of Firearm and Unlawful Possession of Firearm. He was lodged in jail with a total bail of \$78,500.

Juan Rodriguez's charges were Burglary I, Criminal Trespass II, Carry Concealed Weapon-firearm, Unlawful Use of Firearm and Felon in Possession of Firearm. Since this subject is a current Parole and Probation client with Morrow County Community Corrections, they placed a no bail detainer on him.
