in need this holiday season.

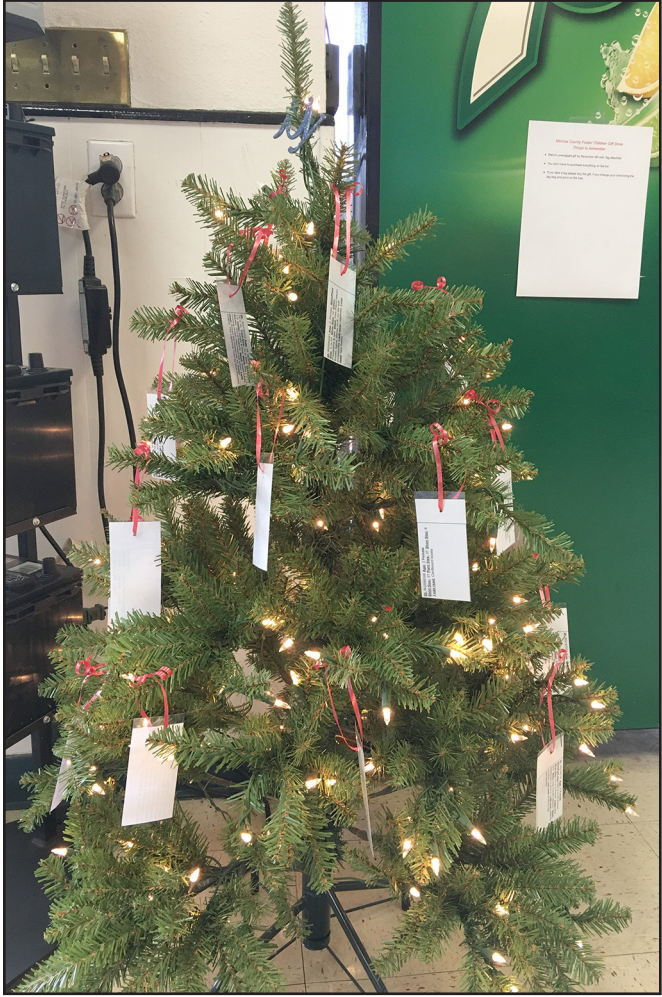
The tree at Les Schwab
