Continued from January 21, 2020: Land Partition LP-N-479-20 and Replat R-N-055-20: Terry Thompson, applicant and Judith Thompson Schneider and Janet Thompson Bliss, owners. The property is described as tax lot 2801 of Assessor's Map 3S 26; tax lot 2200 of 3S 27; and tax lot 801 of 4S 27. The property is located on Baseline Lane approximately 13 miles northeast of Lexington and is zoned Exclusive Farm Use. Request is to approve a temporary concrete batch plant. Criteria for approval include Morrow County Zoning Ordinance Article 3 Section 3.010(C)(14) and Article 6 Conditional Uses.

Opportunity to voice support or opposition to the above proposal or to ask questions will be provided. Failure to raise an issue in person or by letter or failure to provide sufficient specificity to afford the decision maker an opportunity to respond to the issue precludes appeal to the Land Use Board of Appeals based on those issues.
