Oregon Department of erations in the John Da orestry's (ODF) Central and Prineville Units of the Oregon District increased Central Oregon Distric estrictions for forest oprations and the public beginning July 27, 2020. These restrictions are infire to reduce the risk of fire ignition on lands within the Central Oregon District in Lake, Harney, Hood River, Grant, Wheeler, Gilliam, Jefferson, Morow and Umatilla counties. Minimal precipitation combined with increasing hot temperatures has continued to dry wildland vegetation and fuels, increasing the poential for rapid fire spread. The Regulated-Use Closure, affecting recreational and non-industrial landowner activities, stricts many high-risk activities between the hours of 10 a.m. and 8 p.m.,
prohibits activities such as blasting, in addition to restricting other activities. Anyone traveling on forested roads is required to have one shovel and one gallon of water (or a $21 / 2$ pound
fire extinguisher).
