The applicants shall complete a form containing complete information regarding qualifications and reasons for interest in Committee membership. The form shall be signed and dated by the applicant. Membership shall consist of: one member from each of the five incorporated communities in Morrow County; one representative of north Morrow County and one representative of south Morrow County; two members at-large (one being from north Morrow County and one being from south Morrow County); agricultural representation shall be given preference for one of the at-large positions. **MORROW COUNTY LAND USE HEARING**

THE MORROW COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION will hold the following hearings of public interest on Tuesday, December 8, 2020, at 7:00 p.m. at the Bartholomew Building, Heppner, Oregon. Land Partition LP-N-486-20: Gerald Kingery, Owner and Applicant. The property is described as tax lot 100 of Assessor's Map 5N 27E 21A. The property is zoned Rural Residential (RR) and located east of the City of Irrigon on Highway 730. Subject property is located outside the Irrigon Urban Growth Boundary. Request is to partition a 9.92-acre parcel to create 2 parcels. Criteria for approval includes the Morrow County Zoning Ordinance (MCZO) Article 3 Section 3.040 Rural Residential Zone and Morrow County Subdivision Ordinance (MCSO) Article 5 Land Partitioning. Land Partition/Replat LP-S-487-20 R-S-059-20: Morrow County, Applicant and City of Heppner and Morrow Soil & Water Conservation, Owners. The property is described as tax lots 300 and 1000 of Assessor's Map 2S 26E 27AC. The property is zoned Light Industrial (M) and located northwest of the City of Heppner near the intersection of Riverside and Fuller Can-

yon inside the Heppner Urban Growth Boundary. Request is to reconfigure approximately 1.36-acres to create 3 parcels. Criteria for approval includes Heppner City Code 11-3-7 and MCSO Article 5 Land Partitioning. AZ-133-20 Zoning Ordinance Amendment. Morrow County, Proponent. This action is to update Article 9 Administrative Provisions of the MCZO. The criteria for approval are found in MCZO Article 8. This is the first of at least two public hearings with the final hearing before the Board of Commissioners. AZ-134-20 Zoning Ordinance Amendment. Morrow County, Proponent. This action is to update Article 3 of the MCZO for the purpose of creating a Rural Residential 10-Acre Zone (RR10). The criteria for approval are found in MCZO Article 8, State-wide Planning Goal 10 Housing, Oregon Administrative Rule Chapter 660 Division 8. This is the first of at least two public hearings with the final hearing before the Board of Commissioners. Opportunity to voice support or opposition to the above applications or to ask questions will be provided. Failure to raise an issue in person or by letter or failure to provide sufficient specificity to afford the decision maker an opportunity to respond to the issue precludes appeal to the Land Use Board of Appeals based on those issues. **Christmas tree permits available on Umatilla Forest**

Christmas tree permits for the Umatilla National Forest are available to purchase at Forest offices, several local businesses and now online through Recreation.gov. Last year, the Umatilla National Forest was one of 13 National Forests that offered Christmas tree permits online through a pilot program. This year, all National Forests are selling Christmas tree permits online via Recreation.gov as an added convenience for the public and alternative to in-person interactions. Christmas tree permits purchased online must be printed to be valid and can only be used on Umatilla National Forest lands, as specified on the permit. Christmas tree permits cost \$5 each and are limited to one per household. An additional \$2.50 fee will be charged for permits purchased through Recreation.gov.

Traditional Christmas tree permits are still available through Umatilla National Forest offices and several local businesses. All Umatilla National Forest offices are still offering virtual services to the public. Individuals interested in purchasing a Christmas tree permit from the Forest directly may call any National Forest office or send an email to [r6\\_umatilla\\_public\\_inquiries@fs.fed.us](mailto:r6_umatilla_public_inquiries@fs.fed.us). A Forest employee will assist individuals with procedures to receive the Christmas tree permit in the mail upon receipt of payment. Participating vendors are conveniently open evenings and weekend hours. A list of vendors is available online. Heppner Mobil in Heppner is the local vendor. Traditional permits are valid on National Forest System lands only and do

not authorize tree cutting on private, state, or other federally managed lands. As part of the national Every Kid Outdoors initiative, all fourth and fifth graders are eligible for a free Christmas tree permit from their local National Forest. For students to receive a free tree permit, they must present a valid paper voucher printed from Every Kid Outdoors website.
