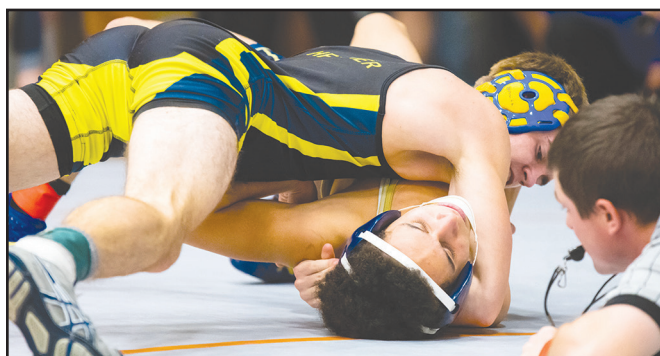

The Heppner boys' wrestling team competed Friday and Saturday at the Culver Invitational, a twenty-three team tournament. The Mustangs boys finished ninth despite only having six wrestlers competing.

competing in the 132-141 lb. bracket, also earned a third place with a 2-1 record for the day, winning by pin in her two wins.

On the boys' team, Roen Waite (120 lbs.), Zach Brown (126 lbs.), Saul Lopez (145 lbs.), Tyler Boor (160 lbs.), Conor Brosnan (182 lbs.) and Cade Cunningham (195 lbs.) competed for the Mustangs. Every Heppner wrestler won at least two matches in their respective weight class.

Oregon legislature passes drought relief funding for Oregon's farmers

Recently the Oregon Legislature passed SB 892 and SB 5561 to provide a \$100 million drought relief package to support farmers and ranchers across the state who have been impacted by historic droughts and severe wildfires of the past two years.

"Our state is home to more than 37,000 ranch and farm operators and this funding package will assist many of them throughout Oregon, especially those located in the heavily impacted areas of the Klamath Basin and Jefferson County,"

said Representative Greg Smith (R-Heppner) who carried SB 892 to the House Floor.

SB 892 passed unanimously in the House and 28-2 in the Senate. SB 5561 passed 52-3 in the House and 26-2 in the Senate. Both bills are headed to the Governor's desk for consideration.

DA's Report

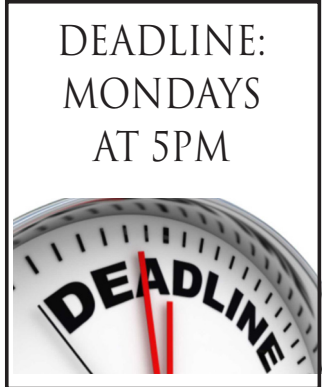
Morrow County District Attorney Justin Nelson has released the following report:

- Anna Marie Helen Figurski was convicted of failure to appear in the second degree and sentenced to 24 months bench probation, 180 days in jail with 180 days suspended upon successful completion of probation and 20 hours of community service work.

- Clinton Raymond Downs was convicted of assault in the third degree, failure to perform duties of a driver and animal abuse in

the first degree and was sentenced to 30 months prison, three years of post-prison supervision and five year license suspension after release.

- Trevor Bien was convicted of criminal mischief in the first degree and sentenced to 24 months formal supervision, 40 hours of community service work, drug evaluation and any recommended treatment, no use of alcohol while on probation and mental health evaluation and comply with any recommended treatment.
