

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office has released the following information:

January 9: Boardman Ambulance, Boardman Fire Department, Morrow County Sheriff's Office received report of a 77 year-old male down, disoriented and cold. The subject was transported to Good Shepherd Hospital in Hermiston.

-MCSO received report of an unauthorized use of a motor vehicle on Little Butter Creek Rd., Echo.

-MCSO received report of a single engine aircraft flying low in the Ione-Boardman Rd. area.

-MCSO received report of a short bed, dark gray Dodge pickup going at high speed and rolling through the stop sign at Seventh in Irrigon. MCSO was unable to locate the vehicle.
