

Heppner Track Senior Night

Last Tuesday, Heppner held its home meet, the last meet before Districts this Friday. This meet also served as Heppner Track's Senior Night, where this year's six seniors were recognized.

The track was very windy at times, making

any race longer than 100m a difficult stretch, but the runners pushed through. Irelynn Kollman kicked the meet off with first place in the 1500m. For the boys 1500m, Jacob Finch placed second with a new PR of 4:54. Later, Kollman would finish second in the 3000m with a new PR of 12:53.81. With the sprints,

Hayden McMahon won the 100m with a time of 12.09, before placing second in the 200m with a time of 25.44. Ed Ellsworth also competed in the 200m and finished in 25.44 as well. This was after he won the 110m hurdles in a time of 17.46. For the girls, Hallee Hisler broke some personal records of her own. She ran the 100m in 13.8 to place fourth, and finished the 200m in 28.43 to place second.

Conor Brosnan and Saul Lopez took care of the throws. Brosnan placed second in javelin with a throw of 131'9. Lopez scored two new personal records, throwing 37'5 in

shot put and 97'9 in discus.

For the jumps, Joseph Sherman led the high jump with a jump of 5'8, earning him first place. Ty Boor

The girls 4x400m relay team concluded the meet with a win (Arianna Worden, Irelynn Kollman, Hallee Hisler and Hannah
