WCVEDG gives out \$171,727 to local organizations

community enhancement grants were recently given out by the Willow Creek Valley Economic Development Group (WCVEDG) board of directors. The money came as part of this year's disbursement from the Columbia River Enterprise Zone. Following is a summary of the projects

The foundation is purchasing the Heppner Gazette-Times building for renovation as a place "to assist startups and small businesses to grow and be successful" the application said. The new facility will also include a commercial kitchen for public use.
