The following night Heppner departed on the long trip to Astoria to meet with the Knappa Loggers Wednesday afternoon. Knappa got off to a slow start this season, going 1-3 in the first four games. After this start Knappa rattled off 18 straight wins to lock up the number three seed. Heppner would try to knock off the Loggers but in five innings, Knappa captured a 13-1 win.

Knappa got hot early, the first innings. Using five walks, two singles, and a triple to put the Mustangs in a hole early. Heppner could not get anything going,

having just one hit through the first three innings of play. Knappa would score three more in the third, and two more in the fourth, making it 13-0 after four innings. Heppner would get a single from shortstop Carson Eyenetich, and Tucker Ashbeck would be hit by a pitch. The runners would move around, stealing bases before Eyenetich came home on an error by the Logger catcher. Ryan Lindsay would also single in the next at bat, before being thrown out stealing second base. Heppner would fall 13-1 and end their season.
