## Obituaries

### Stephen Roy Lindstrom

Stephen Roy Lindstrom passed away on Aug. 3, 2022, in Olympia, WA, at the age of 76. He was born in Pendleton, OR on May 20, 1946, to Roy and Katherine Lindstrom of Ione, OR, becoming the fourth generation of Swedish homesteaders. He was a lifelong member of Valby Lutheran Church, which his grandfather Lindstrom and great-grandfather Lundell helped build in the late 1880's.



Steve attended school in Ione, graduating with honors in 1964. He participated in sports, student government, publications, music, and community affairs. He attended Pacific Lutheran University, graduated from Eastern Oregon College, and later entered the MBA program at Lewis and Clark College.

After college Steve enlisted in the Navy Seabees, and served tours of duty in Vietnam and Antarctica. He was awarded the Navy Achievement Medal for Community Service, and many other decorations for his service to his country.

Steve was the man-

ager of the Port of Morrow, and later the executive vice president of Pacific Northwest Waterways, always advocating for trade and economic development of the Northwest region. He was often active in political campaigns and civic organizations.

A contract lobbyist, Steve worked for a wide range of clients covering transportation, health care, higher education, special districts, business associations, the Oregon Wheat League and more. His lobby expertise took him to Washington DC, Virginia, and Oregon, and he was a lobbyist in Olympia for over 30 years. Steve was an enthusiastic patron of the arts, and participated in several artist-serving organizations and commissions, including the Museum of Northwest Art. He also enjoyed service to the Capitol Furnishings Preservation Committee.

Steve is survived by his daughter, Elizabeth Lindstrom, sister Susan Lindstrom Weiper, sister Christina Lindstrom Bridston, several nieces and nephews, cousins and lifelong friends. His ashes will be scattered over his Lindstrom wheat land and a service will be planned at a later date. Contributions may be made in Steve's memory to Valby Lutheran Church, or the American Heart Association.
