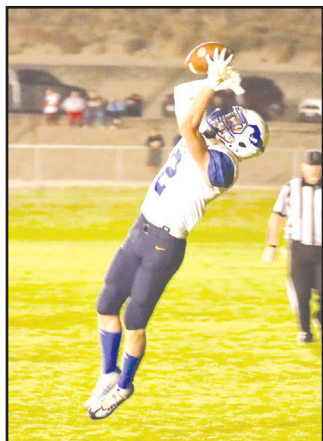
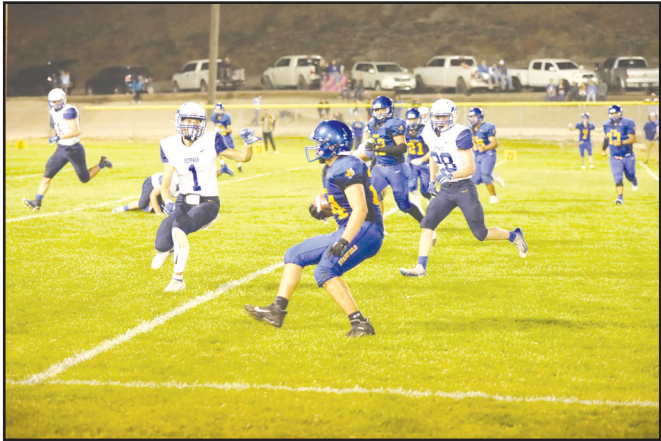


Heppner Mustangs take 34-6 win over the Stanfield Tigers

The Heppner Mustang football team ran their Blue Mountain Conference record to 2-0 with a 34-6 win over the Stanfield Tigers.

Heppner kicked off to start the game and held the Tigers on downs. The Mustangs then only needed three plays to get the game's first score. After a 28-yard run by Caden George; he scored on an 8-yard run for the touchdown. George then scored the 2-point conversion on a run to make the score 8-0, only three minutes into the game.

The next Heppner possession ended with an interception, but then the next time the Mustangs got the ball they scored when quarterback Landon Mitchell ran the ball in from 7 yards out. The conversion attempt failed and that made the score 14-0 at halftime.

The first time the Mustangs got the ball in the second half they went on a 14-play, 80-yard drive that ended in a touchdown when Cameron Proudfoot scored on a 4-yard run. That made the score of the

game 20-0. After the Heppner defense forced a Tiger punt on their next possession, the Mustangs only needed three plays to score again. Mitchell threw a pass to Proudfoot that covered 27 yards for the touchdown. The score at the end of the third quarter was 26-0.

The Mustang defense held Stanfield deep in their own territory and they turned the ball over on downs. Proudfoot scored another touchdown when he punched it in on a 2 yard run. He then ran in the 2 pt. conversion to make the score 34-0.

The Tigers scored their only touchdown of the game late in the fourth quarter and then the Mustangs ran out the clock and won the game by the final score of 34-6.

Heppner had 21 first downs in the game compared to 13 for the Tigers. The Mustangs rushed for 255 yards and held Stanfield to 111. Heppner had 317 total yards in the game and Stanfield 208.

Mitchell was 4-9 passing the ball for 62 yards and a touchdown. Proud-

foot led the team in receiving with 1 catch for 27 yards and a score. George and David Cribbs each had 1 catch for 15 yards and Saul Lopez had a catch for 5 yards.

George led the team in rushing with 103 yards on 15 carries and scored a touchdown. Mitchell rushed for 64 yards on 12 carries and had a score. Hayden McMahon ran the ball for 34 yards and Proudfoot rushed for 31 and had 2 touchdowns. Ty Boor had 13 yards rushing and Landon McMahon ran the ball for 10.

On defense, Cade Cunningham led the team with 9 tackles. George followed with 7 and Proudfoot finished with 6 tackles. Boor recorded 5 and with 4 tackles each were Tucker Ashbeck, Lopez and Mitchell. Jaime Cavan finished with 3 tackles and with 2 tackles each were Cribbs and Jake Lentz.

This week is Homecoming week for the Mustangs and they will take on the Weston-McEwen Tigerscots on Friday night at Les Payne Field. Game time is set for 7 pm.
