RD has conducted an independent evaluation of the environmental assessment and believes that it accurately assesses the impacts of the proposed project. RD will accept questions and comments on the environmental assessment for 14-days from the date of publication of this notice. Any final action by RUS related to the proposed project will be subject to, and contingent upon, compliance with all relevant Federal environmental laws and regulations and completion of environmental review procedures as prescribed by 7 CFR Part 1970, Environmental Policies and Procedures.
