-Continued from PAGE TWO while we were there today," said Dinning of the large unit, adding that a student was already on it and to the point of taking a quiz that day.

"It has the curriculum embedded in it," he said. "We just hit the tip of the iceberg today, but it's got pipe welding, and it's a bigger setup than the one we had before."

It also has a fully enclosed helmet.

"We're excited about it. It's one of those things a lot of people probably would never think we'd have the ability to maintain or get as a school system," he added.

He also reported that students have been using the school's engraver. He said three girls had been using it on tumblers just that day, and students had also been using it to make jewelry and other items.

"So there's a lot of stuff happening. It's been a great thing to walk in that shop and just see all kinds of different projects happening," Dinning said. "Projects that are going out into the community, not just, 'I want to learn to weld or cut a piece of wood or put stuff together.'"

He said the next big thing is to get quotes back for the heavy equipment simulator.

The board also learned that the school will be scheduling sex ed for fourth quarter. Dinning said higher grades would receive a more direct approach.

"You're 16, 17 years old, we're not splitting your genders or anything, we're just delivering content. We're going to get through it and engage in it," Dinning explained.

"Seventh and eighth graders, it's a little different scenario," he added. "We're going to split them up and address them in groups that we feel is the most beneficial to them, so that it's not an opportunity to hear words that are funny for a certain age group with other people in the room."

He said they had several staff who were trained and had taught sex ed before.

"I feel like we'll be well prepared to get it facilitated," he said.

Johnson reported that they were planning the student of the quarter assembly and that this quarter's traits were honesty and helpfulness. About a dozen students were receiving awards from their teachers.

For four weeks every February and March, the fifth and sixth graders at Heppner Elementary take part in Time Out for Reading, a reading program based on the game of basketball. **NOTICE OF STATUTORY RESTRAINING ORDER PREVENTING THE DISSIPATION OF ASSETS IN DOMESTIC RELATIONS ACTIONS**

REVIEW THIS NOTICE CAREFULLY. BOTH PARTIES MUST OBEY EACH PROVISION OF THIS ORDER TO AVOID VIOLATION OF THE LAW. SEE INFORMATION ON YOUR RIGHTS TO A HEARING BELOW.

TO THE PETITIONER AND RESPONDENT: PURSUANT TO ORS 107.093 and UTCR 8.080, Petitioner and Respondent are restrained from:

- Canceling, modifying, terminating or allowing to lapse for nonpayment of premiums any policy of health insurance, homeowner or renter insurance, or automobile insurance that one party maintains to provide coverage for the other party or a minor child of the parties, or any life insurance policy that names either of the parties or a minor child of the parties as a beneficiary.
- Changing beneficiaries or covered parties under any policy of health insurance, homeowner or renter insurance, or automobile insurance that one party maintains to provide coverage for the other party or a minor child of the parties, or any life insurance policy.
- Transferring, encumbering, conveying, or disposing of property in which the other party has an interest, in any manner, without written consent of the other party or an order of the court, except in the usual course of business or for necessities of life. This paragraph (3) does not apply to payment by either party to:
  - Attorney fees in this action;
  - Real estate and income taxes;
  - Mental health therapy expenses for either party or a minor child of the parties; or
  - Expenses necessary to provide for the safety and welfare of a party or a minor child of the parties.
- Making extraordinary expenditures without providing written notice and an accounting of the extraordinary expenditures to the other party. The paragraph (4) does not apply to payment by either party of expenses necessary to provide for the safety and welfare of a party or a minor child of the parties.

AFTER FILING OF THE PETITION, THE ABOVE PROVISIONS ARE IN EFFECT IMMEDIATELY UPON SERVICE OF THE SUMMONS AND PETITION UPON THE RESPONDENT. IT REMAINS IN EFFECT UNTIL A JUDGMENT IS ISSUED, UNTIL THE PETITION IS DISMISSED, OR UNTIL FURTHER ORDER OF THE COURT.
