

Sheriff's Report

November 17, 2022— Boardman Ambulance responded to a patient with chest pains who advised they were pulling off at the I-84 off ramp in a black Ford Explorer.

-Boardman Ambulance and Boardman Fire responded to a 27-year-old female in Boardman who was having chest pains, difficulty breathing and loss of feeling in the right arm. Patient was transported.

-Morrow County Sheriff's Office, Irrigon Ambulance and Irrigon Fire responded to a possible death. A 66-year-old female in Irrigon was unconscious with unknown breathing.

-MCSO responded to a report that a man with a knife was threatening another man. MCSO arrested Jose Armando Tinoco.

-A man advised he was missing his black and white border collie, Tip. He believed the dog jumped out of his truck between Heppner and Ione, possibly when he stopped for gas at Lexington. Tip had a collar but no tag.
