Morrow County, Amazon Web Services ink six new data centers

Umatilla Counties (where data centers have also been built) total more than \$15.6 billion from 2012-2021. Through these agreements, AWS anticipates hiring hundreds of people in various roles to support the construction, maintenance and operation of their data centers. Hiring for these roles will take place as construction nears completion.

AWS has not provided a specific timeline for construction and operation of the data centers. However, they have stated that the 15-year abatement period for each agreement will begin in the first calendar year after the certificate of occupancy is granted for the first data center build.

This suggests that construction may begin in the near future.

Water usage by the data centers is a big concern to communities. AWS says it has been working across its infrastructure to reduce water consumption, using advanced cloud services to analyze real-time water use, identify and fix leaks, and gain other efficiencies. The company is improving operational efficiency by eliminating cooling water use in many of their facilities for most of the year, and instead using outside air for cooling. AWS is also focusing on using sustainable water sources, such as recycled water and rain-water harvesting, wherever possible.
