Transportation (ODOT) will be chip sealing 41 miles of the Heppner-Spray Highway (OR 207C). The project will run from milepost 41 at the junction of Oregon Highway 19, 2.5 miles east of Spray, to milepost zero at the junction of OR 206 (at Ruggs).

The work is expected to be completed around June 22. All dates are dependent on weather conditions that may impact the project start and end times.

A chip seal consists of a layer of emulsified oil to help preserve and extend the useful life of existing pavement surfaces.
