## Federal judge upholds **Oregon gun law** Measure 114 still awaits trial in Oregon

in early June, U.S. District Court Judge Karin Immergut ruled that Oregon's new gun laws banning large-capacity magazines and requiring permits are constitutional under the United States Constitution in their entirety.

Immergut made the ruling in a 122-page opinion published late Friday afternoon, in which she said banning large capacity magazines and requiring permits to purchase firearms are in keeping with "the nation's history and tradition of regulating uniquely dangerous features of weapons and firearms to protect public for September in Harney

State Attorney General Ellen Rosenblum welcomed the news, saying in a statement that "Measure 114's provisions are common sense safety measures that will save lives."

However, the Oregon Firearms Federation called the ruling "absurd."
