The SAGE Center will present the 10th annual Morrow County Harvest Festival on Saturday, Oct. 7, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at 101 Olson Road in Boardman.

The harvest festival will be exclusively outdoors and will feature a large variety of vendors with high-quality, regionally produced agricultural goods and handmade artisan crafts.

Threemile Canyon Farms will provide an opportunity for attendees to fill a bag full of locally grown produce at the seventh annual 'Harvest Bounty for Youth in Agriculture.' In exchange for a small donation to a local youth program, visitors can pack a grocery bag full of traditionally grown potatoes, carrots and organic onions. Through partnerships with organizations like FFA, Boardman Parks and Recreation District, Umatilla National Forest and more, the "Kid's Corner" will showcase numerous free youth activities. Fa-

vorite activities returning this year are mule-drawn wagon rides, face painting and pumpkin painting.

Special needs students get taste of the rodeo life at Children's Rodeo Sept. 14



Smiles, laughter and lots of rodeo fun will fill the Pendleton Round-Up Arena on Thursday, Sept. 14, at 10:30 a.m. at the annual Children's Rodeo.

Sponsored by Inter-Mountain Education Service District (IMESD) and the Pendleton Round-Up Association, this event provides children with special needs ages five through 10 years the opportunity to be cowboys and cowgirls inside the famous rodeo location.

About 50 children from across eastern Oregon will participate this year. Students from IMESD's component school districts in Baker, Morrow, Umatilla and Union counties are eligible to participate.

The rodeo participants will enjoy various activities that include riding a horse, a horse-drawn buggy ride, barrel racing on stick ponies, "steer" roping, riding a pretend bull, milking a mock cow, Native American drumming and more.

Participants will also be able to enjoy the theme of the day, Tough Enough to Wear Pink. Each participant receives a T-shirt, cowboy

hat, lariat, scarf and a photo with their cowboy/cowgirl volunteer.

Spectators are welcome at the Children's Rodeo and admission is free, but people will need to pay for tickets to the regular Round-Up Rodeo later in the afternoon.

Dozens of volunteers, including PRCA and local cowboys and cowgirls, IMESD volunteers, Round-Up volunteers and community members work to make the Children's Rodeo a success each year.

Community to honor 9/11 responders with stair-climbing event

Community members are invited to an event honoring the fallen firefighters and other first responders of the 9/11 tragedy on Sunday, Sept. 10.

The event will begin at 7:45 a.m. as fire trucks drive through downtown Heppner in a silent parade.

The trucks will make their way to the Morrow County Fairgrounds, where opening ceremonies beginning at 8 a.m. will include raising the flag, a prayer for the fallen and a speaker

explaining the event.

A Fireman's Breakfast will begin at 8 a.m. Donations are appreciated.

At 9 a.m., the main event will begin as firefighters and members of the community begin climbing—and climbing. Participants will climb 110 flights of stairs to remember those who lost their lives that fateful Tuesday.

Anyone is welcome to sign up and join the climb. Community members do not need to wear full gear

for the climb, and both individuals and teams are welcome. Kids' activities and crafts will also be available while the climbing is in progress.

The event will also include a silent auction at 10 a.m. Auction items have been donated from a variety of local businesses.

symptoms such as headache, body aches, joint pains, vomiting, diarrhea, or rash.

Rarely, those infected can experience severe symptoms such as high fever, headache, neck stiffness, stupor, disorientation, coma, tremors, convulsions, muscle weakness, vision loss, numbness and paralysis. Recovery from severe illness might take several weeks or months.

People should consult their health care providers if they have symptoms. Health care providers can contact the Morrow County Health Department for information on West Nile virus testing.

Barron offers these tips for protecting against mosquitoes:

-Eliminate sources of standing water that are a breeding ground for mosquitoes, including watering troughs, bird baths, ornamental ponds, buckets, wading and swimming pools not in use, and old tires.

-When engaged in outdoor activities at dusk and dawn when mosquitoes are most active, protect yourself by using mosquito repellants containing DEET, oil of lemon eucalyptus or Picardin, and follow the

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directions on the container.

-Wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants in mosquito-infested areas.

-Make sure screen doors and windows are in good repair and fit tightly.
