

## Sheriff's Report

MCSO January 5

-Boardman Police Department reported a subject kept calling, but wouldn't text back. BPD checked the location but no one was around.

-Boardman Police received a request from a subject for a welfare check on his brother. The caller said he was unable to make contact with him for the past three days and was concerned about his welfare. BPD made contact and the brother was okay.

-Heppner Ambulance responded to a report of a 61-year-old female having trouble breathing, shaking and vomiting. The subject was transported to Pioneer Memorial Hospital in Heppner.

-MCSO, Heppner Ambulance, Heppner Fire Department, Ione Fire Department and Lexington Fire Department received report of a structure fire on N.E. Chase St. in Heppner, with smoke coming from the house.
