February 2nd

-MCOS officers received information.

-MCOS officers completed extra patrol at Wagon Wheel Loop/ Depot Ln, Irrigon.

-MCOS received a theft complaint occurring at Loves Travel Stop and Country Store on Tower Rd, in Boardman. The reporting party says he left his phone in the bathroom, and it was taken. Officers filed a report and went over options with the reporting party.
