

## Sheriff's Report

-Continued from PAGE EIGHT

-Graffiti, Occurred on S First St, in Irrigon. Someone tagged the side of a barn, the side of a house, as well as the neighbors' properties and the mailboxes. There is one camera on the property. Disposition: REPORT TAKEN.

-Driving Complaint, Occurred at Se Division St/Se Utah Ave, in Irrigon. The reporting party advised that a silver Nissan Maxima drove past him at a high speed at the intersection of Division St and Utah Ave, heading towards Tenth St.

-Abandoned Vehicle, Occurred on Wilson Ln, in Boardman. A red Ford Focus has been parked outside the reporting party's residence for three days. \*Vehicle was tagged.

-Driving Complaint, Occurred on Se Utah Ave, in Irrigon. The reporting party states that a silver G6 with tinted windows was racing on Utah Ave towards 6th St. Disposition: UNABLE TO LOCATE.

-Alarm, Occurred at Irrigon Elementary School on Se Wyoming Ave, in Irrigon. Zone 14 customer, general fire alarm at the high school.

-Dog Complaint, Occurred at Wilson Ln/Peters Rd, in Boardman. The reporting party found a small tan and white Chihuahua wearing a red collar. No phone number was provided, but the dog has a license number. \*\*RP located the owner.

-Alarm, Occurred at Bank Of Eastern Oregon on W Main St, in Ione. Commercial panic alarm at SEO. \*False alarm.

-Citizen Assist, Occurred on Ne Garrigues St, in Heppner. The reporting party is trying to get a hold of a doctor to prescribe her medication. \*\*\*Patient's medical history was provided with her information, and they will contact her within 21 days.

-Driving Complaint, Occurred on E Highway 730, in Irrigon. The reporting party advised that a white van was speeding, possibly going 85/90 mph, swerving in and out of traffic, and even hit construction cones. \*Unable to locate the vehicle.

-Driving Complaint, Occurred on Se Utah Ave, in Irrigon. The reporting party observed a blue Chevy Cruze with a license plate ending with MUD. The vehicle was seen driving down Utah Ave towards First St. The reporting party mentioned that the driver has no license and was also seen driving near the school earlier today.

-Trespass, Occurred on W 2ND St, in Ione. The reporting party advised that she has been trespassed from this location and was just notified by her father that she was on the property (RP does not know the exact date). \*MCSO made contact, and the female has been trespassed.

-Driving Complaint, Occurred on Se Ninth St, in Irrigon. The reporting party observed a dark-colored Challenger speeding at approximately 50 mph heading towards Thirteenth St. Deputy was unable to locate the vehicle.

-Welfare Check, Occurred on Se Skyline Dr, in Heppner. The reporting party advised that a female called her twice and said she was very confused. The female is in her 80s. The reporting party is concerned that she may be having a medical emergency. MCSO and HEPA responded, and the female was declared code 4. The patient refused

medical assistance.

-Extra Patrol, Occurred on Kunze Ln, in Boardman. The reporting party requested extra patrol as people were trying to break into their property (J&S) and were messing with the gate.

### MCSO- Nov 17

-Vehicle Check: There was a report of a car parked sideways across the railroad tracks on I-84 West in Boardman. MCSO and Boardman Police Department (BPD) were dispatched to the scene. However, they were unable to locate the vehicle.

-Driving Complaint: A driving complaint was received regarding a black Ford crossover SUV/hatchback on SE Utah Ave in Irrigon. The female driver was reported to have sped through Utah Ave heading towards Tenth Street.

-Juvenile Complaint: A resident on SE Eighth Ct in Irrigon reported that children were kicking at their door around midnight. Video footage was available and the resident requested contact with a deputy.

-Driving Complaint: A blue, silver, and gold group of older model Buicks was observed driving together on I-84 East in Boardman. The vehicles had temporary tags and did not allow other vehicles to pass in between them. The complainant found this behavior suspicious and requested officers to be aware. The case was referred to another agency.

-Driving Complaint: A white four-door Chevy pickup was reported for speeding on SE Utah Ave in Irrigon, heading towards Tenth Street. However, the vehicle was unable to be located.

-Information: According to an update from an unidentified person (UPD), a stolen truck was spotted heading west on Highway 730, just past Patterson Ferry Rd in Irrigon. MCSO responded to the scene and completed the necessary actions. Additionally, Matthew Blackmarr was arrested by MCSO for Violation of Restraining Order and was booked at the Umatilla County Jail with no bail.

-Driving Complaint: A white Dodge Journey was reported for speeding on SE Utah Ave in Irrigon. The driver also exhibited aggressive behavior by flipping off another motorist.

-Animal Complaint: A dead cow carcass was discovered in the field behind a residence on SW Nevada Ave in Irrigon. The complainant requested that deputies speak to the owners about having the carcass removed as it was attracting coyotes. A deputy spoke to the cow owner who confirmed that the cow would be removed in the next few days.

-Animal Complaint: A dog complaint was received regarding a dog that had been coming onto a property on Highway 74 in Heppner. The complaint further stated that one of their cows was now missing. The owner did not require immediate response, but a deputy made phone contact and conducted a search of incident history, but was unable to find any matching descriptions of missing cows.

-Dog Complaint: A black and white medium-sized dog was reported as potentially abandoned, as it was seen lying about 10 feet off the road on Kunze Ln in Boardman. The reporting party observed the dog earlier in the day and then again later in the day on the north side of the road. The deputy took the dog to a pet rescue facility,

and the owner was later located and provided with the pet rescue's information.

-Noise Complaint: A noise complaint was called in regarding a red short bed Dodge pickup truck with chrome rims parked in front of a residence near the intersection of SE Utah Ave and SE Brandon St in Irrigon. The vehicle was playing loud music, disturbing the complainant. However, officers were unable to locate the vehicle upon arrival.

-Burglary: A resident on SE Crimson Ct in Irrigon reported a burglary. The incident occurred sometime between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm that day.

-Driving Complaint: An officer reported a vehicle swerving all over the road and changing speeds near the Mill Zone on Highway 74 in Heppner, Oregon.

-Driving Complaint: Another driving complaint was received regarding a small gold car that was observed driving extremely slowly with loud music on SE Utah Ave in Irrigon. However, the vehicle was unable to be located.

-Driving Complaint: A black sedan was reported for speeding on SE Eighth St in Irrigon. The vehicle came off Seventh St, turned on Utah Ave, and then accelerated towards Idaho. The deputy was notified but was currently out of position.

- EMS Dispatch: Received a lift assist request on NW Church St in Heppner. An 80-year-old female needed assistance from bed to another location. Heppner Ambulance (HEPA) and Heppner Fire Department (HEPF) responded and provided lift assistance.

- EMS Dispatch: Report of a 67-year-old male experiencing extreme abdominal pain at Oasis RV Park on W Highway 730 in Irrigon. Irrigon Rescue and Ambulance (IRRA) responded, but the patient refused transport.

- EMS Dispatch: Walk-in patient complaining of chest pain at Irrigon Fire Hall on NE Main Ave in Irrigon. The patient was transported.

- Motor Vehicle Accident: Two-car crash report-

ed at Irrigon Medical Clinic on N First St/Columbia Ln in Irrigon. SAUCEDO CARDENAS, ANDREA was issued a citation. No further details provided.
