

Sheriff's Report

MCSO Dec. 20

-Theft Complaint

Occurred at Division Rd/Depot Ln in Irrigon. The subject was arrested by MCSO for Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle, Theft in the First Degree, and Criminal Trespass in the Second Degree. Additionally, there was a warrant from MCPP for Possession of Stolen Property/Aggravated Theft in the First Degree. The subject was taken into custody and housed at the UCJ without bail. Another warrant from OSPB with case number 12817093 for Identity Theft and Theft in the First Degree was also served, and the subject was lodged at UCJ without bail.

-Burglary

Occurred on Sunflower Flat Rd in Heppner. The RP reported that two males claiming their vehicle was broken down entered her residence without permission. It is believed that they stole firearms from the RP's house. The RP suspects that these individuals left towards the lake. The vehicle description is unknown, but both males were described as larger in size, white, and were wearing heavier, darker coats and jeans. The RP did not grant the individuals access to her residence and only discovered them inside when she woke up.

-Information

Occurred on Se Fourth St in Irrigon. The RP stated that one of her employees found a bag of kittens tied up in the middle of the road. The employee posted about it online, and a female reached out claiming they were her kittens, which she had bought for her third-grade son at AC Houghton School. However, when the kittens were picked up, the female confessed that her current boyfriend disliked the cats and had trapped them in the bag with the intention of having them run over while she was at work. The RP is concerned about the welfare of the student and requested that deputies check on him or contact the RP to discuss available options.

-Trespass

Occurred at Love's Travel Stop and Country Store on Tower Rd in Boardman. The RP reported that there is a male individual residing in a white Pontiac that has been parked in their parking lot for the past week. The RP has already asked him to leave, but he consistently moves to another parking spot. The vehicle does not have a front license plate, and the back is not visible. The male is possibly Hispanic. The RP would like the male to be trespassed from the location permanently. At the time of the report, the male was parked on the north side of the car park. A deputy made contact with the person, and they moved along as requested.

-Driving Complaint

Occurred on Se Utah Ave in Irrigon. The RP reported that a silver G6 was speeding on Utah Avenue, heading towards Division and towards the school.

-Driving Complaint

Occurred on Se Utah Ave in Irrigon. The RP advised that a newer white Dodge Journey drove swiftly past their house, disregarding the stop sign at Seventh Street and continued towards Division.

-Driving Complaint

Occurred on I 84 E in Boardman. The RP reported that a black Volkswagen was tailgating them and driving erratically. The RP decided to pull off at the next exit to let the vehicle

pass.

-Driving Complaint

Occurred on Se Utah Ave in Irrigon. The RP reported that a Geo Tracker or Honda Passport drove at high speeds towards Tenth Street. The color of the vehicle is possibly dark red.

-Animal Complaint

Occurred at Wilson Ln/Olson Rd in Boardman. The RP observed two brown and black cattle attempting to escape. The cattle were wearing ear tags.

-Extra Patrol

Occurred at Riverview Mobile Court on E Highway 730 in Irrigon. The RP reported an ongoing issue of locating cigarette buds near her van, around halfway to the neighbor's trailer. The RP clarified that neither she nor her neighbor smoke and is unsure of the source of these cigarette buds. The RP mentioned that this is happening sometime overnight and requested extra patrol to monitor the area.

MCSO Dec. 21

-Information:

RP discovered a bag of kittens tied up in the middle of the road. The owner of the kittens, who bought them for her son, admitted that her current boyfriend trapped the kittens in the bag with the intent of harming them. RP expressed concern for the student and requested assistance from deputies.

-Trespass:

Occurred at Love's Travel Stop and Country Store on Tower Rd, in Boardman. RP reported a male in a white Pontiac who had been living in the parking lot for a week, despite being asked to leave. The male, possibly Hispanic, moved the vehicle to another parking spot when asked to leave. RP requested that the male be trespassed for life. Deputy made contact with the person, and they moved along.

-Driving Complaints:

Multiple reports of vehicles driving recklessly or speeding. Specific details were provided for each incident, including the make and color of the vehicles and the direction they were headed. Urgent action not specified.

-Animal Complaint:

RP reported two brown and black cattle attempting to escape with ear tags on Wilson Ln/Olson Rd, in Boardman.

-Extra Patrol:

RP noticed cigarette butts halfway to her neighbor's trailer, despite neither her nor her neighbor being smokers. The buds appeared overnight, and RP requested extra patrol for surveillance. Exact location not provided.

MCSO Dec 22

-Disturbance

Occurred on Smith Rd. in Heppner. Law enforcement responded to a report of a disturbance on Smith Rd. Further details regarding the nature of the disturbance were not provided.

-EMS

Emergency medical services were requested at the Northwestern Motel on N Main St. in Heppner. A 63-year-old male was involved in a motor vehicle incident and requested medical assistance. The Oregon State Police (OSP) were already on scene with the male.

-Domestic Dispute

A domestic dispute took place on Se Gilmore St. in Heppner. The parents were involved in a physical altercation, with the male subject reportedly searching for a firearm. As a result, the subject was

arrested by the Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) for Attempted Assault I, Assault II, Unlawful Use of a Weapon, and Menacing. The subject was subsequently lodged at the Umatilla County Jail with no bail.

-Extra Patrol

Extra patrols were requested on Division Rd. in Irrigon due to recent thefts of equipment and property. The MCSO was asked to conduct patrols throughout the day, utilizing one call for service per day while checking multiple times.

-911 Hangup/ Abandoned/ Accidental

Two hangup calls were made to 911 from the Morrow County Government Center on Ne Main Ave. in Irrigon. During the first call, the caller hung up before an interpreter could be connected. On the second call, an interpreter was able to communicate with the male caller, who claimed that the FBI in Miami, Florida had tampered with his phone, allowing him to only dial 911. The male caller mentioned the possibility of being in Washington but did not provide a specific location.

-Dog Complaint

A dog complaint was received from Nw Oregon Ave. in Irrigon. The caller reported that their neighbor's dog had entered their property and killed two rabbits. The caller mentioned being armed but stated that they would secure their weapon. They requested a deputy to be dispatched to handle the situation.

-Driving Complaints

Multiple driving complaints were reported in relation to different vehicles. A white dump truck and construction vehicle were reported to be traveling at a high rate of speed on Se Utah Ave. heading eastbound. A FedEx truck, described as white and green, was reportedly heading eastbound towards Tenth St. on the same road. Additionally, a white Chevy Malibu with a red back bumper was observed speeding on Se Utah Ave. towards Tenth St.

-Disturbance

A disturbance was reported at 200 Nw Oregon Ave. in Irrigon. The caller could hear their neighbors arguing and heard an object hitting the wall. It was mentioned that the residence had two children. A deputy made contact at the location and determined that no crime had occurred, and the incident was verbal only.

-Theft Complaint

A theft complaint was made on N H St. in Ione. The complainant reported the theft of two full propane bottles from their residence. The theft was classified as cold, indicating it had occurred in the past. The caller requested contact from law enforcement.

MCSO Dec. 23

-EMS:

A call was received from Mary E. Bell regarding a non-injury incident where an 83-year-old female slipped out of bed and got stuck due to a blocked door.

-MVA-Fire:

An individual was cited for careless driving after an accident at Nevada Avenue and Fourth Street. They are required to appear at the JC on January 17th, 2024.

-Disturbance:

A Hispanic male wearing black pants was reported to be banging on a door and yelling on Olson Road. The individual was arrested for Criminal Trespass II and taken to UCJ.

-Extra Patrol:

Division Road in Irrigon

required extra patrols throughout the day due to thefts of equipment and property. One call for service was requested but multiple checks were needed.

- Driving Complaint:

A black Cadillac Escalade was reported for speeding on Se Utah Avenue towards Tenth Street.

- Animal Complaint:

A deer was found unable to get up in a yard on Se Cowins Street in Heppner. It was observed falling repeatedly.

- Trespass:

Two subjects were reported to have stolen items from Marvin Strickland's house on Shoemake Road. Dispatch is attempting to gather more information.

- Disturbance:

A person on a bike was reported to be riding in the area of E 2nd Street in Ione and yelling obscenities at people.

- Assault:

An assault occurred at Lakeview Heights on Willow Creek Road in Heppner involving a client assaulting another client. The assailant was arrested and lodged at UCJ.

- Disturbance:

A male on C Street in Ione was causing a disturbance and yelling obscenities. The individual was arrested for Dis Con II and Resisting Arrest, and lodged at UCJ.

- Disturbance:

Ione Community Church on E Main Street received reports of an individual yelling at people and throwing objects.

- Suspicious Activity:

A resident on Country Garden Road in Irrigon reported hearing tapping on her window, but no one was seen or heard outside. A deputy was requested to check the area.

- Assault:

A male individual assaulted another person on Marshall Loop in Boardman. The victim requested an ambulance for medical assistance. No further details provided.

- Domestic Disturbance: Bella Vista Estates on Paul Smith Rd. in Boardman experienced a domestic disturbance involving two males yelling and fighting. The situation prompted a female to request police intervention. No additional information provided about the incident.

- Suspicious Activity:

A report from Sleep Inn on Front St Se. in Boardman indicated an individual behaving suspiciously in the back parking lot. The subject, whose gender remains unknown, was described as wearing a dark coat and carrying a dark backpack with two garbage bags, one black and one white. They were last seen heading towards the residence area between the trailer park and the Amazon fence.

- Theft Complaint:

Irrigon Mini Mart located on E Highway 730 in Irrigon experienced a theft incident involving a white truck. The suspect stole from the 76 station within the store while an employee was lighting Christmas lights. The suspect also accessed the store's safe. The vehicle fled towards Hermiston at 8 am. The store has surveillance cameras, but the reporting party does not have access to the footage.

- Welfare Check:

A call was received on Se Chase St in Heppner during the night from an unknown number emitting sounds resembling a crying baby. This morning, the same number called

back, and a distressed female voice was heard. The reporting party is unsure of the caller's identity but requested a welfare check on a potential owner. The reporting party has obtained a name and identified the individual as a client. They wish to have the person checked on and are also coordinating with a CCS worker to gather more information and an address if available.

- Suspicious Activity:

A report was received regarding a residence on Highway 74 in Lone that had been broken into. The gate was found open and various items were scattered in the yard. The caller suspects that the campers and sheds were also tampered with. The caller was not present at the scene.

- Driving Complaint:

A construction crew in a gray Chevy pickup truck with clear strobe lights on top, along with a cargo trailer, was observed speeding from Seventh Street towards Tenth Street on SE Utah Ave in Irrigon.
