NOTICE FOR PUBLICATION.

In case the town of Gresham at said time shall have no duly appointed City Attorney, then to the Mayor of the town of Gresham, a copy of such measure, and the said City Attorney or Mayor of the town of Gresham, shall within five days provide and return to the Recorder a ballot title for such measure. The ballot title shall be printed with the numbers of the measure on the official ballot. In making such ballot title the said City Attorney or Mayor shall to the best of their ability give a true and impartial statement of the purpose of the measure, and in such language that the ballot title shall not be an argument for or liable to create prejudice against such measure. Any person who is dissatisfied with the ballot title provided by the said City Attorney or Mayor for any such measure may appeal to the Council asking for a different title, and giving the reasons therefor, and why the title prepared by the City Attorney or Mayor is improper; and the Council may approve the ballot title prepared by the said City Attorney or Mayor, or may by resolution prescribe another ballot title therefor, and the ballot title so approved or so prescribed by the Council shall be the title placed upon the ballot. Such ballot title shall in no case exceed one hundred words, and shall not resemble in so far as possible any other ballot title filed for any measure to be submitted at the same election. The Recorder of the town of Gresham shall number such measures and ballot titles in the most convenient and consecutive manner. The affirmative of the first measure shall be numbered 100 and the negative 101 in numerals, and the succeeding measures shall be numbered 102, 103, 104, 105 and so on. It shall be the duty of the Recorder to bring said ballot titles and numbers upon the official ballot; measures referred to the voters by petition shall be designated "Referendum ordered by petition of the people"; measures proposed by initiative petition shall be designated "Proposed by initiative petition"; charter amendments submitted by the Council without initiative petition shall be designated "Charter amendments submitted to the voters by the Council."

SECTION 10.
Where a special election is called either on petition for proposed ordinance or charter amendments by the initiative, or for submitting ordinances by the referendum, or on charter amendments proposed by resolution of the Common Council, the Recorder shall publish such proposed ordinances, referendum measure or charter amendment with the ballot title and number in full in the official newspaper of Gresham once or oftener within the twenty-one days immediately preceding the special election at which said proposed ordinance, referendum measure or charter amendment is to be voted on, or in the event of there being no official newspaper, by posting printed or typewritten copies of such measures in at least five conspicuous places in said town for a like period of ten (10) days. A like rule as to publication or posting shall be observed where proposed ordinance, referendum measure or charter amendments are

to be submitted at the regular election.

SECTION 11.

Legal voters of Gresham are qualified to sign a petition for the referendum or for the initiative for any measure which he is entitled to vote upon. Any person signing any name other than his own to a petition, or knowingly signing his name more than once for the same measure at one election, who is not at the time of signing the same a legal voter of Gresham, or any officer or other person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not exceeding fifty dollars, or by imprisonment in the city jail not exceeding 25 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the municipal court.

SECTION 12.

The manner of voting upon measures submitted to the legal voters shall be the same as is now or may be provided by law. No measure shall be adopted unless it shall receive the affirmative majority of the total number of lawful votes cast on such measure and entitled to be counted thereon. If two or more laws on the same subject or containing provisions that will conflict shall be approved by the voters at the same election, the act receiving the greatest number of affirmative votes shall be proclaimed to be the law adopted.

SECTION 13.

The votes on measures and charter amendments shall be counted, canvassed and returned as votes for candidates are counted, canvassed and returned.

SECTION 14.

The Mayor shall within fifteen days from the time of such election proclaim by the publication thereof in full once in the official newspaper or, in the event of there being no such newspaper, by posting printed or typewritten copies of such proclamation in at least five conspicuous places in said municipality the adoption of each measure and amendment which shall have received the affirmative majority of the total number of votes cast thereon, and upon such proclamation such measures and amendments shall become in full force and effect, except in cases provided in section 13, with reference to two or more laws on the same subject or containing provisions that are conflicting. In cases of ordinances which have been passed by the Common Council and voted upon by referendum, proclamation of the result of such vote shall also be made, and such ordinance shall continue in effect or cease to be in effect according to such result from the time of such proclamation.

SECTION 15.

Where referendum petitions shall be signed by the required number of legal voters against any ordinance passed by the Common Council same shall be filed with the Recorder within ten days after the passage and approval of the ordinance in question, no ordinance shall take effect and become operative until ten days after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor, or passage by a two-thirds vote over the veto of the Mayor, except measures necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health or safety of the town; and no such emergency measure shall become immediately operative until same is passed by a majority of all the members of the Common Council and also approved by the Mayor.

SECTION 16.

The Common Council shall by ordinance order special elections to vote upon measures to be submitted to the voters upon the proper filing of an initiative or a referendum petition as hereinabove set forth; provided, however, that upon the passage of a resolution by the Common Council without an initiative petition of any measure to be submitted to the legal voters at a special election it shall not be necessary to enact an ordinance calling such special election, but said resolution shall in a separate section thereof provide for and contain a call or order for such special election.

SECTION 17.

Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety and peace of the town of Gresham in this, that the present system of water supply is insufficient, inadequate and unfit to supply the town and inhabitants thereof with an adequate supply of good, pure and

wholesome water; and inasmuch as the present sewer system of said town is insufficient and inadequate to meet the present requirements and needs of said town; and inasmuch as the charter of said town provides for the erection and maintenance of a water system and water works for the purpose of supplying said town with good, pure and wholesome water and inasmuch as the charter of said town provides for the laying of all necessary sewers therein; and inasmuch as an election has heretofore been held by which it was attempted to authorize the town authorities to take the necessary action to accomplish these ends, and inasmuch as improvements have been undertaken and have been suspended owing to certain irregularities alleged to have occurred in the proceedings relative to said election and inasmuch as it is necessary to accomplish these purposes that certain proposed charter amendments be submitted to the voters of Gresham at as early a date as possible to provide the manner and means of installing and completing said water and sewer systems and inasmuch as it is necessary that this ordinance be passed to provide means for the accomplishment of such purposes, NOW, THEREFORE, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall go into force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
