## GOV. WEST OPPOSED TO CAPITAL PUNISHMENT

The governor's attitude toward capital punishment in this state is of interest to all. There are many who will applaud his attitude. Others will condemn it. Of those who condemn it, not all are at heart in favor of capital punishment. Many cannot see the right of the governor to abrogate an enactment of the legislature. That he has the right to commute the extreme sentence in any given case is clear but to announce that during his term of office there will be no more hangings, looks like taking the law into his own hands. The legislature at the last session, though asked to do so, did not see fit to set aside this law, barbaric though it may be.

Governor West recently issued the following statement:

"There will be no hanging in Oregon while I am governor of the state. The old rule that bloodshed must be expiated by the shedding of blood is, in my opinion, a relic of barbarism and not in consonance or in keeping with the civilization is an antiquated and an uneconomic of the spirit of the 20th century. It remains for the dark ages.

I contend that the spirit and the civilization of this age call for the repeal of capital statutes as the punishment for first degree murder. I believe that imprisonment for life should be the penalty paid for shedding human blood.

"I recommended abolition of capital punishment to the last legisla-

ture. I will again make the same recommendation in 1913, unless the law has been previously amended at the general election of 1912.

"I will, and do advocate the repeal of the capital statute and the limitation of the pardoning power of the governor in relation to life sentences for first degree murder. I hope to see this reform accomplished before the expiration of my term of office and the present barbaric law wiped from the statute books of this state."

closets or urinals without self-closing valves, or tanks without self-closing float valves, and when such may be discovered, the supply will be withdrawn.

Section 14. When a permit has been granted for the introduction of water, a corporation cock, or tap, will be inserted in the main. For a dwelling of ordinary size, the tap will be one-half inch in diameter, and for other buildings of such size as the Water Board may consider proper for the supply of water needed.

Section 15. The tap will be inserted by employees of the Water Board in all cases, and the charge for the work of insertion, payable in advance by the plumber laying the service pipes, will be three dollars for one inch taps, and two dollars for smaller sizes. The tap, and the ferrule connected with it will remain the property of the city, and it shall be unlawful for any person to interfere therewith.

Section 16. The service pipe must be galvanized iron, and in the building the lead pipes must be of a quality and weight corresponding to the A. A. gauge, and the galvanized pipes of a corresponding strength. The lead service from the main to the galvanized iron service must not be less than two feet in length, with a slack of not less than four inches, as security against rupture by settlement of the main or any material of the trench. The lead service must be connected by a wiped joint to the tap in the main, and to a brass soldering nipple at the junction with the galvanized iron pipe.

Section 17. Within and near the line of the street curb a flat-headed round-way stop cock of approved pattern and material must be placed and protected by means of a suitable box, provided with an iron cover, which will be furnished by the Water Board without charge, upon written application of the owner or occupant of the premises, who must keep them in repair, and who shall be liable for any damage caused by the stopcock box or cover not being in proper place or order.

The service pipe from the main to the wall of the building must be not less than two feet below the grade of the street and the surface of the ground in the yard.

Section 18. Just inside the basement wall a stop and waste cock, protected from frost, must in all cases be placed, in a convenient location, by means of which the pipes in the building may be drained at night during freezing weather.

Additional stop and waste cocks should also be placed in sags and bends in pipes when they cannot otherwise be drained.

Water must not be allowed to run to waste through any faucet or fixture in order to prevent freezing, or kept running at any time longer than necessary in its proper use, when such waste is found to exist, the water will be shut off from the premises.

No faucets will be allowed on the outside of any building except hose connections, which must be controlled with separate stop and waste cock; provided, that one stand pipe not accessible to the public may be used in the yard for domestic purposes where there are no fixtures in the house, and the latter must have stop and waste cocks, protected from frost. No hose connections will be allowed on sidewalks, except those which have valves inside of the buildings, or which require keys for opening them. They must discharge upwards, so the water can be used for no other purposes than sprinkling.

Section 19. The service pipe, within and without the premises and throughout its entire length to the tap in the city water main, must be kept in repair, and protected from freezing at the expense of the occupant who will be responsible for all damages resulting from leaks or breaks.

Where there is a leak under the street, and it is doubtful whether the water comes from a break in the city main, or from a private service pipe, the employees of the Water Board will make an excavation to determine which it is from. If the leak is found to be from the main, the Water Board will, of course, make all the repairs; but if it is from the service pipe, the occupant of the building will be notified, and must immediately take charge of the excavation, repair the leak, replace the street pavement, and be responsible for all damages which may result.

Section 20. No plumber or other person will be allowed to make connections with the city mains, or to make alterations in any conduit, pipe or other fixture connecting therewith, or to connect pipes when they have been disconnected, or to turn off or on any premises, without permission from the Water Board.

Section 21. Plumbers doing any work by which water may be drawn from the city mains, must make in writing a true and accurate report of work done, and deliver it at the Water Office within three days after completion, and must describe the positions of the tap, service pipe, curb stop cock and stop and waste cock by reference to street and lot corners, on blank forms to be furnished at the Water Office.

Section 22. Plumbers failing to perform their work, or properly re-

port the same, according to the established rules and regulations, or executing their work unskillfully, or to the damage of the City Water Works, may be debarred from making connections with the city mains.

Sections 23. Agents of the Water Board may have free access at proper hours of the day to all parts of the buildings and premises in which water may be delivered from the city mains, for the purpose of inspecting the condition of the pipes and fixtures and the manner in which the water is used.

Section 24. On failure to comply with the rules and regulations established as a condition to the use of the water, or to pay the water rates in the time and manner hereafter provided, the water may be shut off until payment is made of the amount due, with fifty cents in addition for the expense of turning water off and on.

Section 25. After the water has been shut off at the stop cock at the curb, as provided in Section 25, if it should be turned on by any person except an employee of the Water Board, an excavation will be made in the street, the water shut off at the tap in the main, and not turned on again until the arrears, the cost of replacing the street pavement, and three dollars for the expense of shutting the water off and turning it on, are paid.

Section 26. The water rates will be due and payable in advance at the Water Office, on the 5th day of each month, and if not paid within the first five days the water will be shut off from the premises, as provided in Sections 25 and 26. The water rates, for water not metered, may be paid in advance for any number of months for each calendar year.

### WATER BY MEASURE.

Section 27. 1. Water for operating hydraulic elevators, and in certain other cases where large quantities of water are used, (such cases to be determined by the Water Board as they arise), shall be measured by meters to be approved by said Board.

2. Said meters to be furnished, installed and maintained by the users thereof, under the supervision of the Water Board, and the water used to be charged for at meter rates.

3. When a meter gets out of order, and fails to register accurately, the charge shall be according to the average quantity of water used daily, as shown by the meter when in order.

4. Meters for pipes more than one inch in diameter will be allowed only by special agreement with the applicant.

Section 28. The foregoing rules and regulations must be strictly complied with in every instance, and water must be paid for by all persons supplied, according to the following "Schedule of Water Rates":

Employees of the Water Board are not permitted to make any exceptions whatever.

The right is reserved by the Water Board to amend or add to these rules and regulations, as experience may show to be necessary or ex-

pedient.

### Water Rates—

Section 1. That in pursuance of the estimate of the Water Board of the probable expense of maintaining and conducting the Water Works during the ensuing year, and also the cost of contemplated alteration, improvement and extension thereof, together with one year's interest on bonds, and payment into sinking fund, as provided by the charter, to be paid for from the income from the sale of water, and in accordance with the recommendations of the Water Board, the following rates are prescribed as the monthly water rates of the Town of Gresham for the year ending December 31, 1912. Said rates payable in advance within the first ten days of each month.

### Dwellings—

Family of ten persons or less, including all occupants.  
Ordinary use of water for drinking, or in cooking or washing, \$1.00  
Each person exceeding ten .10  
Bath tub .25  
Each additional bath tub .25  
Water closet .25  
Each additional water closet .25  
Urinal .25

Hose connection for sprinkling yard, washing porch and like use, see "Sprinkling".

### Stables—

One stall or space for stabling one horse or cow .75  
Each additional stall .25  
Each vehicle exceeding one .10  
Water fixtures, at same rates as in stores.

Stalls boarded up in such manner as to show they are not used will not be charged for. Stables without water pipes, but having access to hose connections or faucets of adjacent buildings, will be charged full rates.

### Municipal Rates, for all Town Purposes—

\$900 per annum.  
Building Purposes—  
For each 1,000 brick laid, including water for mortar .10  
For wetting each barrel of lime for other purposes than laying brick .10  
For wetting each barrel of cement .10  
For wood fibre, per ton .25  
For settling earth in ordinary sewer or pipe trench, per block, 200 feet, as may be determined by inspection by Water Department \$1.00 to 3.00  
For top dressing macadam street, per block .20

### Filling Cisterns (Private)—

"Meter Rates".

### Swimming Baths—

"Meter Rates".

### Motors—

For quantity of water used. "Meter Rates".

### Laundries—

For quantity of water used. "Meter Rates".

### Fire Protection—

Pipes to be used only in case of fire, will be allowed within buildings on the following conditions:

The fire pipes must be entirely disconnected from those used for other purposes, and the hose pipes

or branches must be arranged by means of seals, or otherwise, so that they can be used only in case of fire.

The connection with the main will be made by employees of the Water Board in the same manner as all other connections are made and the charge therefor will be the actual cost of the labor and material furnished.

The charge for each pipe will be as follows:

For a 2-inch pipe	\$1.00 per mo.
For a 3-inch pipe	1.50 per mo.
For a 4-inch pipe	2.00 per mo.
For a 6-inch pipe	2.50 per mo.

### Water by Measure—

The Water Board shall have the right at any time to attach meters, to, or detach meters from the service pipes of such places, and of such places only, as it may deem best; and where water is supplied through meter to charge for the quantity of water used or measured at the following meter rates; provided, the minimum rate of any such place, including the rent of the meter, shall not be less than one dollar, (\$1.00) for any one month, and excepting that the minimum rate for a sidewalk elevator shall be three dollars, (\$3.00), and for inside elevator five dollars (\$5.00), per month.

### Meter Rates—

For the first 500 cubic feet of water, 20c per 100 cubic feet.  
For the next 15,000 cubic feet of water, 15 cents per 100 cubic feet.  
For over 15,500 cubic feet of water, 12 cents per 100 cubic feet.

When any meter is installed the Water Board shall have the right to insist on a deposit equal to an estimated consumption of water through such meter for one month, which shall be returned when the service is discontinued, and all bills paid.

All meters, except such as are required to be purchased by the water users, shall be and remain the property of the Town, and may be removed whenever the Water Board may decide to do so.

Water for other uses or business than those named in the foregoing schedule of water rates may be furnished at special rates to be fixed by the Water Board of the Town of Gresham, Oregon.

Section 29. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to attach to or detach from any water main or service pipe or other connection through which water is supplied by the town to water consumers of the town, or to interfere in any manner with such pipes or connections, without having first obtained the written consent of the Superintendent of the Water Committee or Department, as the case may be.

Section 30. It shall be the duty of each and every plumber to make a report in writing of all connections attachments and extensions as shall hereafter be made by him, within
