There remain, about three culture. hundred dollars more to be raised in order to take up the option given to the committee by Ed. Osborn. The original time of this option has expired, but Mr. Osborn has kindly extended it for a short time. It is necessary to raise this three hundred dollars and take up the option and it should be done ot once. Some have not subscribed, some who subscrbied, have not paid, although all subscriptions were due about March first. No citizen can afford to let this opportunity pass for providing an attractive and suitable home for the Gresham library. The question of location is a dufficult one to adjust. It may or may not be possible to adjust it to suit everyone. The purchase of the present proposed location was undertaken in good faith by all interested.
