The city council of Fairview has passed resolutions declaring the Gresham Outlook the official paper for Fairview.

In the Senate, Bourne of Oregon, who is chairman of the committee on the Postoffice and Post Roads will seek to have a general parcels post amendment incorporated in the bill.

Seven Governors Call Together Development Congress.

Seven governors of Northwest states have joined in issuing a proclamation calling a Northwestern Development Congress to meet at Seattle, June 5 to 8.

The chief purpose of the conference is to plan a campaign for the more rapid development of the states interested and suggest ways and means to stem the tide of emigration from the American Northwest to Canada.

Congressman Lafferty has introduced a carefully prepared bill providing for a settlement of the Oregon and California Land Suit favorable to the people.

Farm Accounting Factor in Success.

The fact that the U. S. Department of Agriculture has established an office of farm management and that the civil service commission recently held examinations to secure men eligible for appointment as assistants in farm cost accounting.

"No farmer has a reasonable excuse to offer for wasting valuable time and labor on crops which, because of climatic or economic conditions," said Mr. Bexell today.

"One object of keeping accounts is to assist in accumulating property. Another important object is to record a continuous history of business transactions for future guidance.
