PROCLAMATION
of the Mayor
Of the Town of Gresham.

Whereas, a certain act entitled "An act to amend Section 12 of Chapter V of the charter of the town of Gresham, entitled "An act to incorporate the town of Gresham in the county of Multnomah, Oregon, and to provide a charter therefor, and to repeal all acts or parts of acts in conflict therewith, filed in the office of the Secretary of State, February 11, 1905, as amended by the people of the town of Gresham at a special election held on the 18th day of September, 1911," and having the following ballot title, to-wit: "Shall the charter of the town of Gresham, Section 12, Chapter V, be amended in such a manner as to give the council power to issue negotiable bonds in an amount not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for the purpose of making extensions to the water system of the town of Gresham and to enter into contracts of employment, purchase materials and condemn land for the purpose aforesaid," which was submitted to the legal voters of the said town of Gresham at a special election held therein on Monday, May 27, 1912, for their adoption or rejection, received the affirmative majority of the total number of votes cast thereon at said special election, to-wit: Sixty six votes for said act to seventeen votes against said act.

Now Therefore, I hereby make proclamation of the adoption of said amendment to the charter of the town of Gresham, in accordance with the provisions of Ordinance No. 65.

Done at the town of Gresham, this 3rd day of June, 1912.
