Do Your Trading at Home.

When you desire to raise money to put through a business proposition in town or county, do you seek it from capitalists in some distant city? Well, not often. You go down the street calling on everyone in sight, and come back on the other side. And yet some men who have often asked for business favors at home in the past, and will ask for them again, do not hesitate to spend money freely and heedlessly in patronizing the merchants of other cities; often, too, with disadvantage and regret. It is an excellent principle in business to stand by the people that stick by you. To Increase Farm Products \$10,000,000.

That the annual agricultural productions of this state could be increased \$10,000,000 in five years without adding one square rod to the farm acreage, was the contention of Dr. James Withycombe, director of experiment stations at the Oregon Agricultural College, in a recent address on the value of demonstration farms. He advocated the establishment of a demonstration farm in each county under competent supervision, the superintendent to act as advisor to the farmers of his district, and to assist in the formation of rural organization for the improvement of educational, social and financial conditions.

In many foreign countries the value of demonstration farms and special agricultural educational work is strongly in evidence, said Dr. Withycombe. The little country of Denmark has made phenomenal agricultural progress under the system of demonstration instruction. With an area equal to but one-sixth of Oregon Denmark supports 2,690,000 people and exports annually over \$100,000,000 worth of butter, eggs and bacon. This is accomplished under adverse agricultural conditions much of the country being so bleak that it is necessary to blanket the fows in pasture to keep them comfortable in summer.

If such results can be secured under such favorable conditions, what results might we not justly expect from a similar system here in Oregon where conditions for dairying and general farming are so favorable?

ORDINANCE NO. 65.

An ordinance providing for the issuance of bonds of the Town of Gresham, Oregon, in the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for the purpose of providing funds with which to make necessary extensions of the water system of the Town of Gresham and to defray the expenses connected therewith, providing and approving the form of the bonds to be issued and the coupons attached thereto and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, by the provisions of certain amendments to the charter of the Town of Gresham entitled "AN ACT to amend Section 12 of Chapter V of the charter of the Town of Gresham, entitled, 'An Act to incorporate the Town of Gresham in the County of Multnomah, Oregon, and to provide a charter therefor, and to repeal all acts or parts of acts in conflict therewith,' filed in the office of the Secretary of State, February 11, 1905, as amended by the people of the Town of Gresham at a special election held on the 18th day of September, 1911," adopted by the qualified electors of the Town of Gresham at the special election held on the 27th day of May, 1912, it was provided that the Common Council of the Town of Gresham have power and authority to borrow money upon the credit of the town and to issue bonds therefor, not to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000), for the purpose of making extensions to the water system of the Town of Gresham; and

WHEREAS, at said special election a majority of the votes cast were in favor of the adoption of said proposed amendment to the charter of said town providing for the issuance of bonds for said purpose; and

WHEREAS, Proclamation was duly made by the mayor and filed with the Recorder on June 3, 1912, as by law provided; and

WHEREAS, no bonds have heretofore been issued in pursuance of the said votes cast at said special election on May 27, 1912, now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the people of the Town of Gresham,

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the Town of Gresham.

Section 1. That the Town of Gresham do issue bonds in the name of and under the corporate seal of said town in the amount of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) in denominations of five hundred dollars (\$500) each, numbered consecutively from 1 to 10 inclusive, the entire issue of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) bonds aforesaid to bear interest at six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, both the principal and interest to be payable to the Fiscal Agency of the State of Oregon, New York City, said bonds to be signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Recorder of the Town of Gresham and the corporate seal of said town to be affixed thereto, whereby the Town of Gresham shall be held and considered in substance and effect to undertake and promise in consideration of the premises to pay to the bearer of each of said bonds at the expiration thereof the sum therein named in gold coin of the United States, together with interest thereon in like gold coin at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, which bonds shall be known as Water Bonds of the Town of Gresham, Oregon, Series 1912, the interest on said bonds being represented by coupons annexed thereto and each of said coupons shall have the signature of the Mayor and Recorder of the Town of Gresham engraved thereon.

Section 2. That the following form be and the same is hereby approved and declared to be the form of said Town of Gresham Water Bonds, Series 1912, to wit: United States of America, State of Oregon Water Bonds of Town of Gresham, Oregon, Series 1912.

No. _____ \$500.00 The Town of Gresham, Multnomah county, Oregon, for value received acknowledges itself indebted and hereby promises to pay to the bearer the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) in Gold Coin of the present standard of weight and fineness on the first day of July, 1912, together with interest thereon in like Gold Coin at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year. Principal and interest payable at the Fiscal Agency of the State of Oregon in New York City, upon presentation and surrender of this bond and the annexed coupons as they severally mature.

This bond is one of a series of bonds of the Town of Gresham, Multnomah County, Oregon, of like date and tenor, numbered consecutively from number 1 to 10 inclusive, aggregating not to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) par value in amount, issued by the said Town of

Gresham under the general provisions of an act entitled:

"AN ACT to amend Section 12 of Chapter V of the charter of the Town of Gresham, entitled 'An Act to incorporate the Town of Gresham in the County of Multnomah, Oregon, and to provide a charter therefor, and to repeal all acts or parts of acts in conflict therewith,' filed in the office of the Secretary of State, February 11, 1905, as amended by the people of the Town of Gresham at a special election held on the 18th day of September, 1911,"

adopted by the qualified electors of the Town of Gresham at the special election held on the 27th day of May, 1912, and proclaimed by the Mayor on the 3rd day of June, 1912, and filed with the Recorder on said 3rd day of June, 1912.

And it is hereby certified and recited that the election authorizing the aforesaid amendment to the town charter of the Town of Gresham, hereinbefore mentioned as a condition precedent to the issuance and sale of this bond has been duly called and held; that proper and due notice was given thereof and that at said election more than a majority of the voters qualified to vote thereat voted in favor of the aforesaid amendment to the town charter authorizing the issuance and sale of this bond; that all acts, conditions and things relating to the issuance and sale hereof have been properly done and performed in regular and due time, form and manner as required by law; that the total indebtedness of said town including this issue of bonds does not exceed the statutory or constitutional limit of the State of Oregon or the limit provided by the charter of said town.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, this bond has been signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Recorder of the Town of Gresham, and corporate seal of said town hereto affixed this 8th day of July, 1912.

Section 3. That the following be and the same is hereby approved and declared to be the form of coupon to be attached to the said Town of Gresham Water Bonds, Series 1912.

Coupon No. 1. \$15.00 On the first day of January, 1913, the Town of Gresham, in the County of Multnomah, State of Oregon, will pay the bearer fifteen dollars (\$15.00) in gold coin of the United States of America at the Fiscal Agency of the State of Oregon in New York City, being six months' interest on its water bond No. 1.

Section 4. That the Mayor and Recorder be and they hereby are authorized and instructed to prepare, execute and deliver the Town of Gresham Water Bonds, Series 1912, to Morris Brothers in accordance with the terms and conditions of the bid of said Morris Brothers heretofore made and accepted for said bonds.

Section 5. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and peace of the Town of Gresham, in that it has at this time no water system and has no source from which to obtain water for the purpose of extinguishing fires and supplying the inhabitants of the Town of Gresham, and providing the said town with good and wholesome water, and inasmuch as improvements have been undertaken and are in course of construction and nearly completed and extensions thereto are under way and a large indebtedness has been incurred for said purpose; and inasmuch as a contract for the purchase of said bonds has been entered into and the form of bonds must be approved before the purchaser will accept the same, an emergency is therefore hereby declared, and this ordinance shall go into force and effect from and after its approval by the Mayor and the publication by the Recorder as by law required.

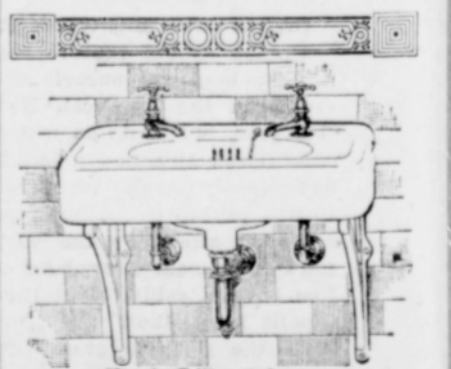
