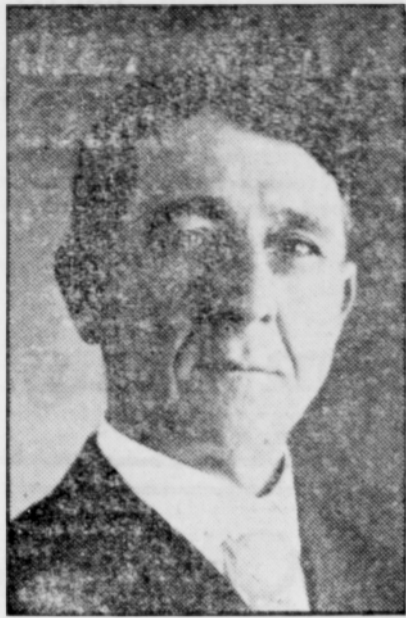

**Fairview**

FAIRVIEW, Oct. 21.—Another accident happened at the foot of the mill east of town on the sandy road on Saturday night, but this time there were no fatalities. In fact, the six occupants of the car which went over the bank, 15 feet to the bottom, escaped with only a few bruises and scratches. The machine was owned and driven by Johnson, of the Johnson Safe Co., of Portland. He with a party of five were returning from Troutdale, where they went to look at some real estate, about 10 o'clock Saturday night when just after they crossed the bridge, where Mrs. C. C. Heslin lost her life and Mrs. J. O. Davis was so seriously injured last winter, their machine suddenly skidded and seemed to fairly fly out into 20 feet of space and land upright at the bottom of a 15-foot embankment. In their mad flight they were hurled over the tops of small trees and a mass of boulders, which if they had struck, would have resulted in death or serious injury. The car was being driven at the rate of nearly 60 miles per hour and the tremendous momentum is no doubt what saved it from turning turtle in the wild leap. Johnson claims he lost a wheel in the soft dirt which has just been filled in at the bridge approach, and this caused the loss of control of his machine. One front wheel and one back wheel is wrecked, the hind one being completely smashed into splinters, the wind shield and front of the car and the cover are demolished. Young Ackley of the Ackley Land Co., was one of the occupants of the car and lost \$40 from his pockets, \$20 of which have not yet been found. The car was not raised until today and all day Sunday a crowd was gathered to see the spectacular wreck, and scores of machines which passed during the day stopped and the passengers alighted to view the wreck.

**Millage Tax Bill Repeals Legislative Appropriations.**

Editor Gresham Outlook:—The argument printed in the Voters Pamphlet over the signature of H. J. Parkinson and others attacking the Millage Bill for the support of the Agricultural College and the University of Oregon, contains a misstatement of facts so vital as to demand immediate correction. Although the Millage Bill clearly and specifically repeals the appropriation aggregating \$503,000 made by the last legislature, for buildings, equipment, etc., at the University, it is asserted in the argument against the Bill that "friends" of the University are trying to kill the referendum on the \$503,000 appropriated by the 1911 legislature for the University of Oregon. If they succeed, the tax payers will have over \$1,288,000 to dig up for the schools in 1913.

No effort is being made to secure the passage of these referred Bills, and even should they receive a favorable vote they would be automatically repealed by the passage of the Millage Bill so there can be no double appropriation.

Investigation shows that instead of increasing the rate the Millage effects a saving on the average appropriations for the last ten years.

This bill, being a measure regulating taxation, must of necessity be submitted under the initiative.

**WANTS COMMON JUSTICE.**  
Working Men and Women of the State Oppose Malicious Laws.

In order to make a farce and a laughing stock of popular government and the initiative and referendum, two measures have been initiated by the big business interests which are deadly opposed to the rule of the common people. One proposed law limits free speech in cities of 5,000 or over, and is so glaring an example of class legislation that it is absolutely revolting to a right-thinking individual. The measure, however, is aimed at the organizations that are seeking to improve conditions for the common people. Eight thousand signatures to this bill were secured in Multnomah county, where the people on a referendum of a similar ordinance, defeated the forces of big business overwhelmingly. The working people of this county ask you, the voters of the state, to deal justly with them and defeat the anti-boycott and anti-free speech bills.
