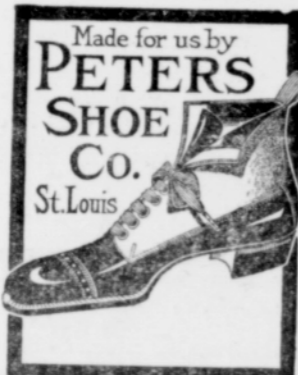

Buried at Gresham

The funeral of John H. Underwood took place on Sunday last from the Gresham Baptist church, Rev. F. M. Burtch officiating. The attendance was large, many being present through sympathy for the friends and relatives of the deceased who are numerous throughout the whole of Eastern Multnomah, and who deeply regret that the innocent one had to suffer for the wrongs of others. Mr. Underwood's death was mentioned in Friday's Outlook, he having committed suicide in East Portland early that morning by drinking carbolic acid. This act was the result of domestic difficulties.

Leonard Guy White

Leonard Guy White was born at Wahoo, Nebraska, May 10, 1873, and died October 29, 1912. He came to Oregon in 1880. In 1887 he came with his parents to Damascus where he has made his home ever since. On Jan. 17, 1900 he was united in marriage with Mary Luverne Farrer. Two children were born to them, one son Floyd, deceased, and one daughter Evelyn now six years old. He leaves besides his widow and little daughter, his father E. T. White, four brothers and two sisters, Dr. E. E. White, Des Moines, Iowa, D. R. White, Wash., Jessie E. Farrer, Portland, Laura A. Rodlun, Gresham and M. R. and R. W. White of Damascus.

The funeral services were held at the Union chapel near Damascus, Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Rev. J. H. Wood preached the sermon. Interment was in Damascus cemetery.

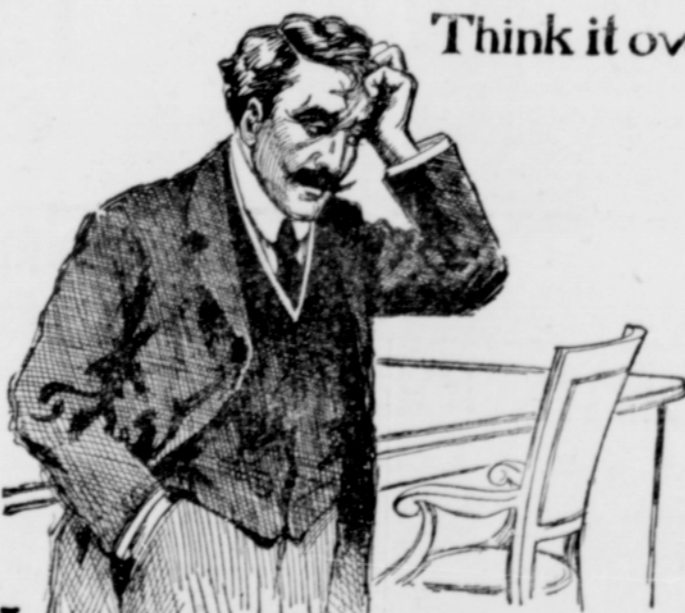
