Theo Stensland and wife called on their parents Christmas eve.

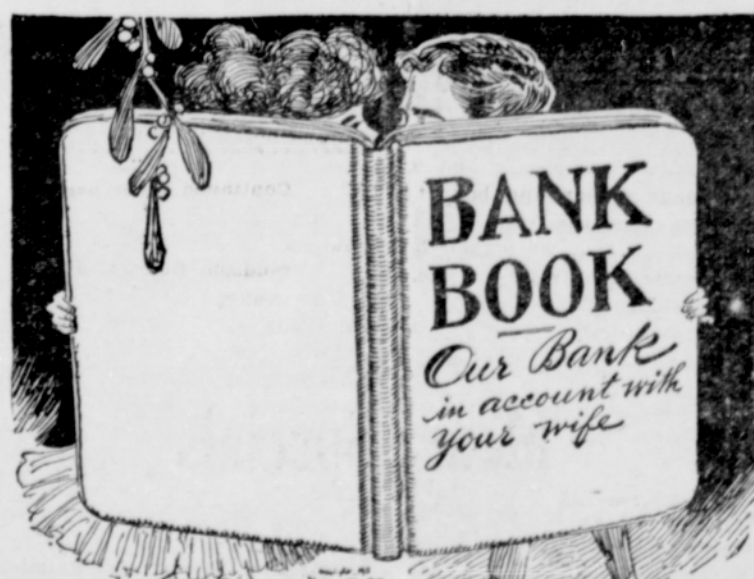
Ever Stensland was home over Christmas.
