THE BIBLE IN THE SCHOOLS.

That the Bible be read daily in the Portland public schools was a recommendation adopted by the Portland Ministerial association recently.

'Nothing could more strongly provoke irreverence of the Bible,' Dr. Elliot said, 'than perfunctory reading every morning in a schoolroom before all classes and creeds of children.'

The resolution which recommends that 'the proper authorities institute proceedings at once to introduce the reading of the scriptures, without comment,' was introduced by Rev. Delmar H. Trimble.

Whether or not the reading of selections from the Bible would tend to provoke irreverence would depend upon the teacher. If it were more 'perfunctory' reading and the reader were irreverent, such would be the effect on the scholars.
