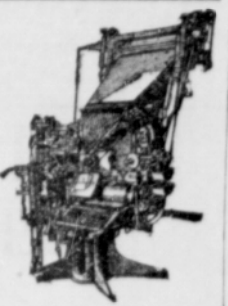

Hood River Falls in Line for Highway.

By a vote of 1625 to 428 the people of Hood River county last week authorized a bond issue of \$75,000 for the completion of the Columbia River Highway through their section of the state.

In addition to this action of Hood River, Columbia county has issued bonds to the extent of \$360,000 for good roads, \$260,000 of which will be applied to the Columbia River Highway.
