The True French Spirit.

Juice is Shipped.

On August 3 the first car load of loganberry juice was shipped by Salem manufacturers direct to the New York City market. The drink has never scored a failure where a trial has been given, and it is believed that this shipment will prove the opening which the grower of the loganberry long has sought for marketing the fruit which is an Oregon specialty.

The loganberry growers of western Oregon need a combination of capital to get behind the industry by financing a juice refinery at some central point, and the establishment of mills for crushing the berries at or near the places where they are largely grown.

When ripe for juice purposes the loganberry is a bad shipper, and for that reason the plan suggested is considered feasible. There are a number of small juice manufacturing plants in western Oregon, but none of them with the capacity to handle the crop that is now grown, and which cannot be sold in either the green state or put through the dryers.

A cheap and easily made substitute for horn can be made of wheat flour and sodium silicate. This substitute is very hard and strong and, by inserting organic dye into the composition while mixing, it can be colored to imitate almost any kind of horn substance.

Home Canning of Vegetables

[By Miss Ruth Jackson, head of department of agriculture in Southern Idaho Normal.]

Vegetables for the Home Pantry. The home canning of vegetables is a comparatively easy and inexpensive process, particularly in low altitudes. The fact that elaborate and expensive apparatus is unnecessary is to be emphasized.

A good sized wash boiler and a piece of muslin folded three or four times and tacked together to fit the bottom of the boiler are all the necessary utensils, and these every household possesses.

Place cloth in the bottom of the boiler and pour on enough water to bring it up about two inches on sides of jars—just enough to prevent boiling dry during cooking. A small amount of water is more efficient. It makes the boiler easier to handle; it heats more quickly; and it cooks vegetables at a higher temperature.

For home use, glass jars are the most economical. After the first cost, the glass can be used indefinitely with only the additional cost of good rubbers each year.

The jars should be sterilized by placing them upside down on a folded cloth in a large pan containing about an inch of water. Cover until water boils. The jars may be sterilized several days in advance, if kept closed.

Always can vegetables just fresh from the garden. These can often be improved by allowing them to stand in cold water a short time.
