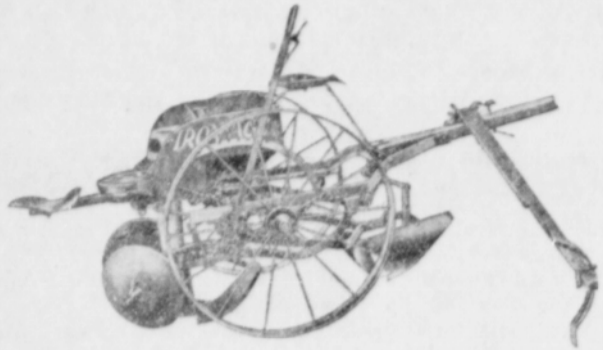

CANNERY OPERATION ASSURED THIS YEAR

Manager D. E. Towle made the statement this morning that the Gresham cannery will be operated to probably its full capacity this year, sufficient funds having been secured for the purpose.

The directors are making the request that those who have fruit will defer making contract elsewhere until they have consulted the manager of the Gresham cannery, as special inducements will be offered to handle the entire product of this section.

COMMERCIAL CLUB TO BE REVIVED

An effort is being made to revive the Gresham District Commercial club and make it again a live factor in the civic affairs of the community.

A small but enthusiastic meeting of members was held in the city hall last Friday night at which the needs of an active commercial organization were presented and plans for future work discussed. O. A. Eastman presided and H. L. St. Clair was chosen temporary secretary.

It was pointed out that Gresham has a commercial club, which is an incorporation with a charter from the secretary of state, and has a duly adopted and adequate constitution and by-laws. One year ago there was failure to hold a meeting and elect officers and the former officers have simply held over, while during the past year or two only two or three called meetings have been held. Mr. Eastman has continued as president and Will Metzger as recording secretary.

The meeting last Friday night resulted in the following motion which was unanimously adopted. That a committee of three be appointed to solicit the attendance of members and all business men of Gresham and vicinity to attend a meeting for the revival of the club on a working basis, such meeting to be held at the city hall, Friday night, April 21st. Frank Jones, Max Schneider and H. L. St. Clair, were appointed.

One of the subjects to be taken up and furthered by the club will be extension of the four-inch water main from Main street west to the property of the Beaver State Motor company, so that the company by an extension through its property can secure adequate water for fire protection. This is said to be needed and desired by the growing factory located within the city limits. On this and other matters of local improvement a careful consideration and recommendation by a strong commercial club, composed of the substantial business men and farmers of the locality will have some weight with both local and country authorities as their interests may appear.

Hence an urgent appeal is made to all who are interested in the work of the commercial club to be present next Friday night and give the club the benefit of their presence and support.
