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### TRUE AMERICANISM.

Convincing proof of the sincerity of purpose that actuated Theodore Roosevelt is now splendidly in evidence. ### MILK FOR THE SCHOOLS.

There is no longer any question about the practicability and popularity of school lunches, particularly in cities and large towns. The discovery that not a few children come to school ill nourished and thus incapable of displaying the maximum of efficiency, coupled with the introduction of domestic science courses in many schools, has made the school lunch a permanent and growing institution.

In connection with the idea it has remained for the Spokane schools to make an experiment during the past summer which is of more than passing interest. The experiment consists in nothing more or less than supplying milk for the luncheons of pupils in two of the city's grammar schools. The health supervisor in charge of the work says this was done because examinations showed that some of the children were not sufficiently nourished; that the malnutrition was due in some cases to lack of proper food, and in others to the fact that the children would not take time to go to lunch. The city furnished milk at cost, and it was given free to those who could not pay for it.

After the test of two months, Doctor Drake, the supervisor, declares his intention to recommend to the board of education the adoption of the plan for all Spokane schools this fall. The teachers in the two schools where the experiment was conducted report better work on the part of their pupils, due to improved health. The cost is said to have been very small as most of the children paid for the milk. The scheme is pronounced an unqualified success, and there is said to be no doubt that it will be continued and enlarged.

Milk is, as everybody knows, a highly nutritious food. Often when there is little or no appetite for solid food, milk is acceptable and palatable. If free from pollution and up to the standard required by most municipalities of today, it is as healthful and wholesome as any food could well be. For growing children it is especially to be commended. The Spokane idea seems destined to find favor in many communities elsewhere. The cost of supplying the milk is relatively small, and the results appear to be well worth the price.

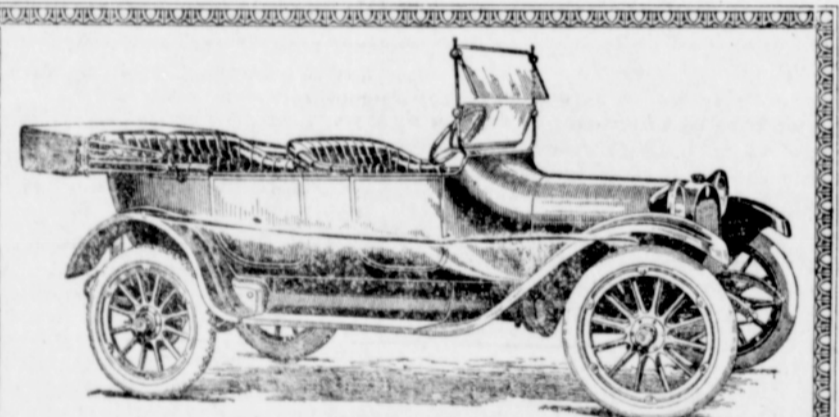
