The first medical college in the western part of the United States was Rush medical college, founded in Chicago in 1837 by Dr. Daniel Brainard, who was born in Whitesborough, N. Y., 194 years ago, May 15, 1812. Rush college commemorates the name of Dr. Benjamin Rush, who was born near Philadelphia, of Quaker parentage in 1745. Dr. Rush served as an apprentice to a Philadelphia physician for six years, and then completed his medical education in Edinburgh, London and Paris. He was a signer of the Declaration of Independence, one of the founders of the first American anti-slavery society and the greatest physician of his day. During the yellow fever scourge in Philadelphia in 1793 he visited more than 100 patients daily.
