Claude Smith was down from La Grande the latter part of last week. He is trying to arrange for an adjustment of the picture show difficulty.

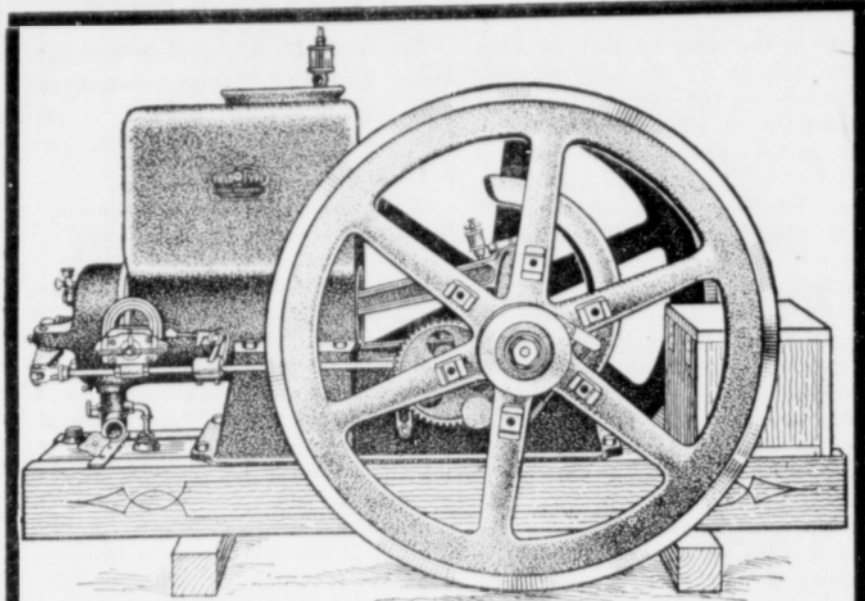
