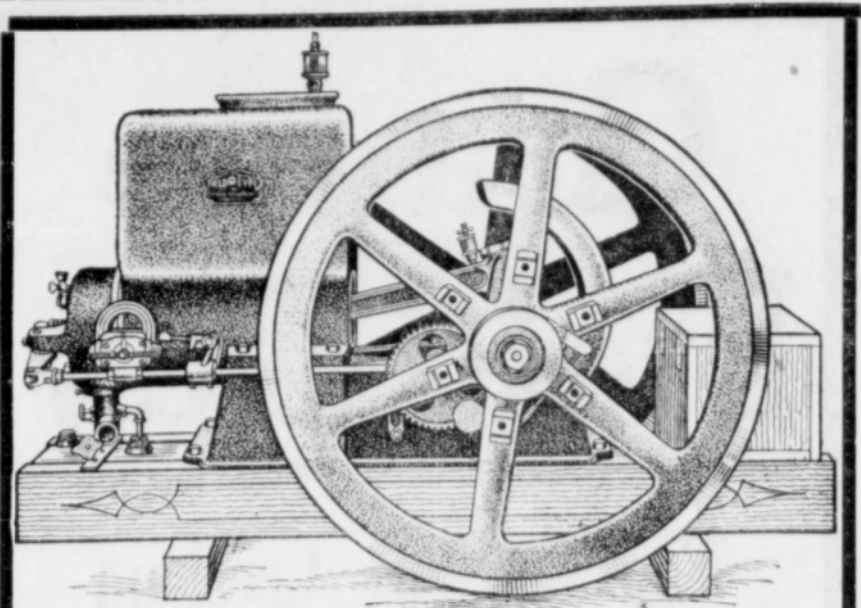
Ed Aylsworth has just received word that his brother, Chester A. with a division of the regular army has been made a second lieutenant.
