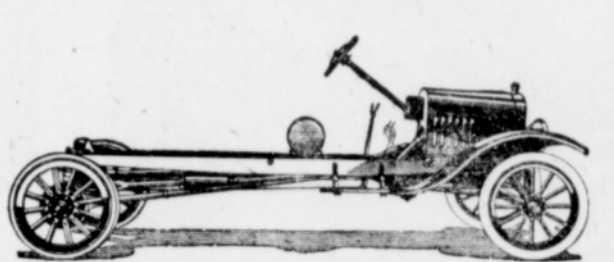
PLEASANT VALLEY

By the looks of things in and around this vicinity, we know of no slackers.

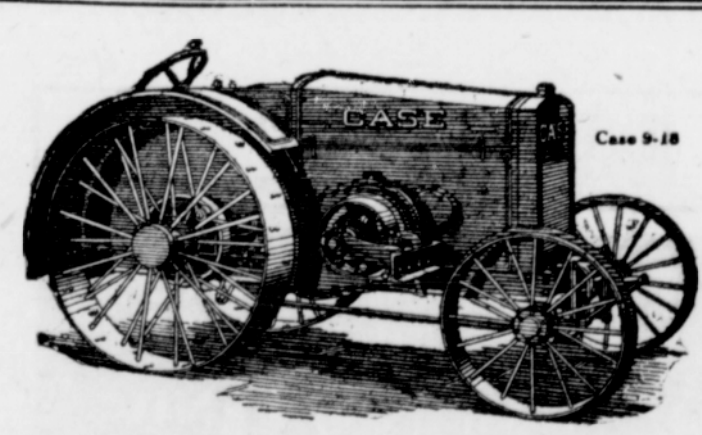
