**INTERESTING PROGRAMS AT METHODIST CHURCH**

Two services of great interest are planned for the Methodist Episcopal church next Sunday. The day will open "Methodism's May Program," which will be conducted throughout the church by its national war council between May 13 and 19. It is the plan to raise in the churches of Methodism, during that week, a million dollars to strengthen the hands of camp pastors, to facilitate the work of the chaplains, care for French orphans and to assist in making Christ real to the soldiers of the United States. The Gresham church will be given the opportunity to do its share of this great work at the morning service on Sunday.

Rev. J. Montclair Brown is chairman of the committee which has arranged for patriotic meetings to be held in every Methodist church in eastern Multnomah during the coming week. District Attorney Evans will speak here under the auspices of the church on Sunday evening, May 19th.

Mother's Day exercises are being planned by the Epworth League for next Sunday evening, and mothers are especially invited to attend. A fine program consisting of music by the orchestra, solos and duets and an address by the pastor will be given. The service will begin at 7 o'clock and all are invited to attend.

**COMPANY ASKED TO PAY AFTER POLICY EXPIRES**

An interesting insurance problem may have to be solved by the courts, arising from the circumstances surrounding the fire which took the home of Peter Salquist at Powell Valley a few weeks ago.

Mr. Salquist's policy in the Mc-Minnville company had expired but a few weeks before the fire and about the time that a change of agents had been made for this vicinity by the company. The old agent was just ready to make a renewal of the policy when he was taken off the job, so was unable to continue an insurance that had been in force for about 20 years.

The new agent, who has an office in Portland, wrote Mr. Salquist about the matter before the fire occurred, but upon a visit to the agent's office was not able to find him. Thus the matter stood when the house and the most of its contents were burned.

Mr. Salquist, through an attorney, has made a demand upon the company for the amount of the insurance he carried, setting out in his complaint that his failure to have insurance at the time of the fire was due to negligence of the company through its action in not giving him the right kind of an opportunity to make a desired renewal.

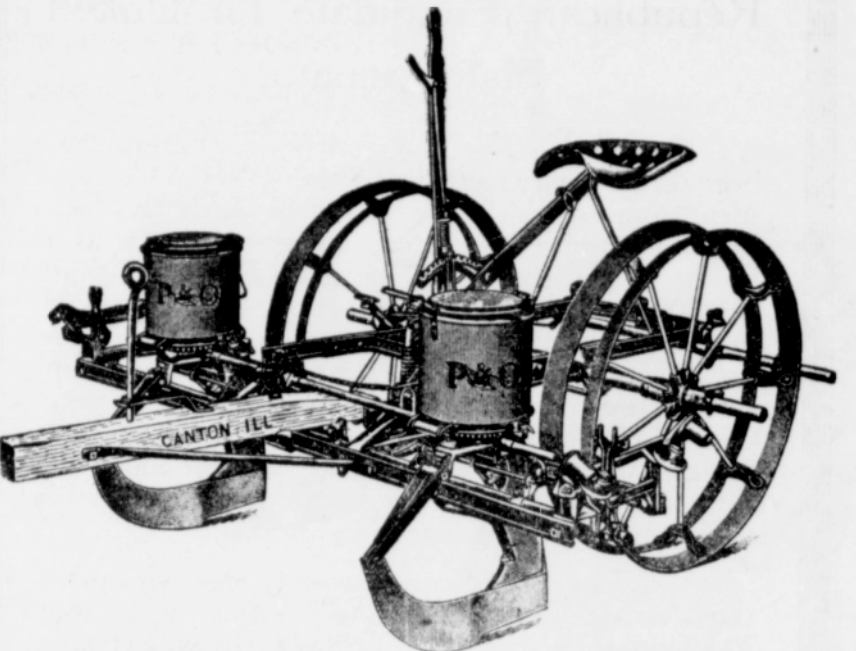
